## ROUNDALAB

One hundred and forty Round Dance Leaders from twenty three states and two Canadian Provinces met in San Diego, California last October for the annual ROUNDALAB (The International Association of Round Dance Teachers, Inc.) Convention. There was a strong feeling of togetherness and purpose as leaders with diversified backgrounds and experience gathered together for the betterment of the entire profession. A recommended cue sheet format was adopted for a one year trial period. Phases One and Two of Round Dancing were readied for presentation to the Callerlab Convention in March. Other Phases - Three, Four, Five and Six, were explored and tentatively established. Various types of an Education Program were demonstrated and discussed. An Educational Committee was established.
