## TRIMMINGS by Lillian Sutton

Trimming your square dance dress gives you an opportunity to be creative and to express your individuality. The trims should always be an integral part of the dress, enhancing rather than overpowering the design or fabric of the dress. In seeking the right trimming detail, you will often get a hint from either the fabric or the style of the garment. However, not every dress needs trimming as many times the design of the dress or the individuality of the fabric can stand on its own. Some trims are incorporated during the construction of the garment such as cording, piping, top stitching and tucking, so do plan the trimming before you begin sewing. You will find commercial trimming in the fabric or notion departments. Upholstery and drapery departments carry some unusual trims and although they are intended for furniture or draperies can work beautifuily on a dress or skirt. If your dress is washable, be sure the trim is also, and do pre-shrink it. Commercial trimmings can be expensive, but there are many ways you can decorate your dresses inexpensively with a personal touch.

One way is through your choice and use of the design of the fabric. Border and large prints require little or no trim. You can create design with striped fabrics by combining the stripes vertically, horizontally on the bias, or mitered. Combining prints with solids can also decrease the need for expensive trim. Fabric stores often feature coordinating fabric not on-
ly with prints and solids, but prints that are designed to be used together, checks of various sizes in the same colors, and polka dots with the colors of background and dots reversed.

There are many ways to use checks in a decorative way. They are interesting cut on the bias, smocked, tucked, or embroidered. The June 1984 issue of "Square Dancing" gave directions for chicken scratch embroidery on gingham. Cross stitch is also effective on checks. Shrink the floss before using!

Shaped facings for the neckline can be part of the trim of a dress. Simply apply the facing to the outside rather than the inside of the dress. You might use the dress fabric or a contrasting color for the facing.

Top stitching, saddle stitching and decorative machine stitching are effective trims. Be sure you have a decided contrast in color for these to show to the best advantage. Using a strip of pellon (or similar underfacing) under machine decorative stitching will make it appear more raised.

Tucks are decorative. It's easier for the most part if you tuck the fabric before cutting the pieces. Tucks may be equal or varied in width and distance apart and can be horizontal, vertical or cross tucked.

Embroidery can transform a dress into a work of art. Design your own, buy transfer embroidery patterns, or copy from china, wallpaper, drapery or other decorative fabrics. You can enlarge or diminish the size of the design by using a copying machine, then transfer the design to your pattern piece with dressmakers tracing paper.

Ruffles, applique, quilting, trapunto, cording, buttons, bows, braids, laces, edgings or rick-rack can be used alone or in combination with another type of trim in decorating a square dance dress.

Even though there are many trimming ideas a good seamstress will enjoy creating her own styles of trim. Being guided by your own good style sense, let your fancy lead the way and have fun creating individualized trimmings.

## SEWING INFORMATION by Lillian Sutton

This month we will try to help you with Zipper application. There are two basic methods of putting a zipper in a dress or blouse. They are lapped and centered. The lapped application is probably the best choice for a square dance dress as it is suited to light or medium weight fabrics, gives ample coverage of the zipper, reduces gapping at the waistline and affords less possibility for the folds to catch in the zipper.

There are several ways to finish the neckline facing after the zipper application. The type of application and the position of the slider at the neck edge determines the method selected. For most square dance dresses the slider can be at least $1 / 2$ inch below the finished neck edge so the following method is recommended.

When cutting your garment, increase the centerback seam to $1^{\prime \prime}$. The opening for the zipper should be equal to length of the zipper plus $11 / 2^{\prime}$. Close the opening temporarily with machine basting and press seam open, then follow all other steps as directed in the zipper instructions. After zipper is stitched in place, attach the facing to the neck
edge, trim and clip the seam allowance and understitch a row of machine stitching along the neck edge of the facing -- that secures the trimmed seam allowance to the facing. Turn the facing to the inside, baste and press the edge. Turn under the seam allowance on the left facing, trim away excess to reduce bulk, and slip stitch to the zipper tape. On the right side, clip in on the seam allowance about $1 / 2$ " from the top, fold at an angle to clear the slider, and slip stitch it to the zipper tape. Finish with a hook and eye.


## "NEW"' NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE DIRECTORY
