## RULES FOR THE BANNER STEALING DANCE FOR SEPTEMBER 29, 1985

1. You must call ahead before stealing a banner.
2. One square of badge-wearing dancers can steal a banner.
3. The first square registered at a dance gets the banner.
4. A couple cannot steal the banner of a club they are members of.
5. If a club has a traveling banner, take it.

6 . The stealing club must bring stolen banners to the banner dance.
7. A couple may re-claim only one banner.
8. Banners may be re-claimed at the September 29th Banner Dance.

Some 200 square dance leaders met in Phila. from May 9-12 as Legacy International held its 7 th biennial convention at the City Line Marriott Hotel. Ed \& Angie Jones, Pen-Del, were inducted into the
organization, while long-time members Steve \& Dorothy Musial, Pen-Del, and George \& Olive Wilcox, Mid-East Penn, arranged and conducted a tour of historical Phila. for many visitors attending from coast to coast and Canada. The Wilcox's also presented a paper and held a discussion on Public Relations in square dancing, and were hosts at the registration booth.

Legacy is a non-profit assembly of trustees representing dancers, callers, cuers, publications, record companies, suppliers, foundations, and national convention executives. Legacy, a leadership communication resource center, meets every two years to exchange ideas and formulate proposals and guidelines for the square dance activity. This year 29 "breakout sessions" of presentations and discussions, such as dropouts, new movements, dress code, financing, recruitment and retention of dancers, and sociai aspects were held.

The first session on Thurs. was orientation for 50 new members. People are invited by trustees to become members if they've served the activity during at least five years of dancing, or have served three years as a leader.

Next was an orientation session for those who had to present papers or lead activities. Approximately 100 trustees had some assignment in the three-day (and night) conference. A banquet and entertainment followed, with the results of the 1984-85 dancer survey.

After general business sessions Friday morning, the afternoon, evening, and Sat. morning, were filled with one-hour sessions of presentations, discussions, and summations used in formulating proposals for action by the entire body. Rest, relaxation, and a tour of historic sights were Sat. afternoons activities. After dinner a dance was held, featuring trustees who were callers and cuers.

On Sun. morning a general business meeting was held to review the recommendations from the breakout sessions and to formulate resolutions to be used throughout the square dance activity.

Legacy's achievements are world-wide dancer surveys of opinions, attitudes, and wishes; a forum for the formation of organizations like Round-A-Lab and
N.A.S.R.D.S.; publication of a leadership manual and other tools for Legacy seminars nation-wide; a Hot-line for immediate communication among square dance executives; and a Dancer-Answer program providing a list of contacts in the Nat. Square Dance Directory to help answer questions on square dancing.

Working with the Nat. Square Dance Convention Committee, the Legacy Education Committee conducts seminars at Nat. Conventions. Legacy also encourages local leadership programs (mini-Legacies) similar to the Del. Valley's "Diet" program, and its trustees assist their development world-wide.

## SEWING INFORMATION By Lillian Sutton

It's nice to have a cape for summer
evenings or in air conditioned places. This knitted cape hugs the shoulders nicely and can be worn comfortably while dancing. It knits up quickly and could be done in two colors by using one color for the Brioche and another for the stockinette part.

You will need: Yarn-2 balls, 4-ply (3.5 oz. balls), needles - 8 and $101 / 2$, pattern Brioche: S $1{ }^{*} \mathrm{P} 1 \mathrm{~K} 1$ into st. of row below* Repeat * to * across row.

Cast on 104 sts. with $101 / 2$ needles. 1st row K 1 P 1 .

Part 1: Knit 24 rows in brioche, on 24th row decrease 10 sts. evenly across row. (94 sts.)
Part 2: Knit 6 rows in stockinette st. (K 1 row P 1 row).

Part 3: Knit 20 rows in brioche, on 20th row decrease 10 sts. evenly across row. ( 84 sts .)

Part 4: Repeat part 2.
Part 5: Knit 16 rows in brioche, on 16th row decrease 10 sts. evenly across row. (74 sts.)

Part 6: Repeat part 2.
Part 7: Repeat part 5. (64 sts.)

Part 8: Repeat part 2.
Part 9: Knit 12 rows in brioche, on 12th row decrease 24 sts. evenly across row. ( 40 sts.)

With size 8 needles knit 6 rows in ribbing (K 1, P 1). Cast off. On side of piece pick up 43 sts. with right side facing.

Row 1: Knit 5 . Purl to last 5 sts. Knit 5.
Row 2: Knit 5. Knit 14 K 2 tog, K 1, K 2 tog knit 14, knit 5. Repeat these 2 rows always leaving 2 less stitches on emphasized part of Row 2 until 11 stitches remain (or number to make width of tie desired). Knit 1, Purl 1 for 11 stitches cast off. Work other side the same.

Gene Trimmer, Chairman of the Cailerlab Plus Quarterly Selection Committee, announces the following selection as the Plus Quarterly Selection for the period that began on May 1, 1985:

LOAD THE WINDMILL<br>by Ron Schneider

Starting Formation: Facing lines of four. Timing: 10-12 beats.

Definition: The end dancers do the ends action of Load The Boat; i.e., they circulate two places around the outside of the set and, when they meet the third dancer, they Touch One Quarter to become ends (leader/trailer or \#1 \& \#4) of the final column formation. Simultaneously, the center four do a Swing Thru and, without stopping, Cast Three Quarters by the right end as Column Centers.

Teaching Hints: The end have little or
no trouble performing their actions as they readily understand that action. The centers must be cautioned to establish their wave and then start the Swing Thru action while maintaining both hands at the ready position so the action goes smoothly.

From a Zero Box (Zero routine) Technical Zero - Pass The Ocean, Recycle, Load The Windmill, Circulate, Boys Run.
From a Zero Box (Zero routine) Technical Zero - Flutterwheel, Load The Windmill, Coordnate, Bend The Line.
From A Static Square - Heads Square Thru, Spin Chain Thru, Boys Run, Wheel And Deal, Slide Thru, Load The Windmill, Girls Run, Box The Gnat, Change Hands, Left Allemande.
From A Static Square - Four Ladies Chain, Sides Touch A Quarter, Walk And Dodge, Slide Thru, Pass Thru, Partner Trade, Load The Windmill, Circulate, Boys Run, Pass Thru, Trade By, Square Thru Three-Quarters, Left Allemande.
From A Static Square - Heads Lead Right, Circle To A Line, Load The Windmill, Girls Run, Touch A Quarter, Scootback, Split Circulate, Face Right, Left Allemande.
From A Static Square (Using Half Sashayed Lines) - Sides Lead Right, Circle To A Line, Pass Thru, Tag The Line - In, Load The Windmill, Boys Run, Swing Thru, Swing Thru, Recycle, Pass Thru, Trade By, Left Allemande.

Singing Call Routine - Four Ladies Chain, Heads Touch A Quarter, Walk And Dodge, Swing Thru, Boys Trade, Single Hinge, Boys Run, Load The Windmill, Girls Run, Swing This Girl, Promenade Tag.

## CALLERLAB SEEKS AFFILIATES

Many callers' organizations throughout the country (and some overseas) already are affiliated with Callerlab. Increasing that number to improve communication among callers is a continuing goal of Callerlab.

To become an affiliate of Callerlab, the callers' association need only make application to Callerlab, Box 679, McCauley Avenue, Pocono Pines, PA 18350 and pay an initial fee of $\$ 35.00$. Thereafter, the annual fee for renewal is $\$ 25.00$.

At the time of affiliation, the organization need not have a Callerlab member among its members; however, within three years, at least one of the members of the affiliated organization must be a member of Callerlab and attend the annual Callerlab convention. Convention attendance requirements thereafter are the same as for all members; i.e., once every
three years for organizations in North America and once every six years for organizations outside North America. The affiliated organization is expected to subscribe to the Callerlab Code of Ethics and otherwise support Callerlab policies.

Members of affiliated organizations have no individual status with Callerlab unless they are, in fact, Callerlab members or subscribers.

Affiliated organizations receive selected Callerlab publications such as Direction, Guidelines, Program Lists, Press Releases, etc. and, thus, are able to keep abreast of latest developments. Furthermore, members of affiliated organizations in the U.S. and Canada, who are not Callerlab members or subscribers in their own right, may participate in the Callerlab group liability insurance program by payment of an annual fee of $\$ 5.00$.

Callers' organizations who are not now affiliated with Callerlab are encouraged to acquire status and take advantage of the benefits affiliation offers.

For the quarter that began April 1 , 1985, Harold Bausch, Chairman of the Callerlab Mainstream Quarterly Selection Committee, has announced that there will be no new quarterly figure.
