1948. Over the years, "Sets in Order" (as it was originally called) served as a chronicle for the changes in the square dance activity, witnessing the growth of square dancing from a veritable handful of dancers and callers shortly after WWII, to today when it numbers more than six million devotees and recording the happenings of the activity as it spread around the world.
Along the way, "Sets in Order" became "Square Dancing Magazine", official publication of The Sets in Order American Square Dance Society, the organization which houses in its Los Angeles offices the Square Dance Hall of Fame, which sponsors the Silver Spur Awards and offers scholarships each year to deserving men and women who show a potential for square dance calling. Bob \& Becky Osgood will be continuing The American Square Dance Society and its activities at the Los Angeles address as well as continuing to publish and sell the Caller/Text, The Caller/Teacher Manual,
their various Handbooks, etc. By stopping publication of the magazine, they will have additional time to work with Callerlab and Legacy, which they helped to develop, to plan their twice annual Asilomar vacation institutes on the Monterey Peninsula in California and to expand their library and archives center in their home office.
"It's been a hard decision to make", state the Osgoods, "but today there are so many fine publications, such as the one you are now reading, so that disseminating the square dance news is not the problem that it was when our magazine started 37 years ago. Our dedication to the activity and our love of square dancing is as strong today as it has ever been."

 (continued from page 23)Since square dance attire is an intricate part of our activity, making square dance outfits is an exciting, creative type of sewing. It requires little more than basic sewing knowledge and skill, but with suggestions of fabrics, use of designs, interesting treatment of skirt, bodice, sleeves, your finished outfit can be a flattering one and a joy to wear.

I said this was going to be a sharing experience, and that is hopefully what it will be. Along with sharing my ideas, helpful hints, etc., I would like to hear some of your ideas, too. Any ideas that work well for you; problems you have, for which you would like an answer, send them to me via the editor and I will be happy to use them in a column to pass along to all who share in this fun and pleasurable activity.

My Helpful Hint for this month is: "Shopping for Fabric".

Have in mind a special dance, special season or holiday? Know which colors look well on you and unless you are very conservative, pick a bright, colorful print, stripe or solid color - designs beyond those used for our everyday apparel. Select fabric that is wash and wear ironing a very full skirt can become very time consuming. Even though you may not have a particular style in mind, if the print strikes your fancy, buy it and be creative in making the dress. Think also in the terms of color selection for your partners shirts. If you do not make his shirts, coordinating a print with a solid and adding a tie made of your dress material can create a look of "belonging together'".

So much for now, next month l'll have
ideas on the "what and how" to do with the fabric you have purchased. Enjoy dancing and enjoy being beautifully dressed to dance.

Starting Formation (s): Parallel Ocean Waves or Eight Chain Thru. From parellel Ocean Waves, all Spin The Top, to form a momentary tidal wave. Without stopping, the very center four dancers, in their own wave do another Spin The Top, while the other four dancers Cast Off ThreeQuarters and the outfacers will Run. Ending Formation: One-Quarter Tag - Timing: 16.

Singing Call Figure: Heads (sides) Square Thru, Dosado to a Wave, Swing Thru, Spin The Net, Centers Recycle, Pass Thru, Swing The Corner and Promenade.

Comments: Those who have used this call find good dancer reaction along with a reasonably quick teach. Don informs us that if started from normal waves (right hand waves with men on the ends, ladies in the center), you Swing Thru and then Spin The Net, the Spin The Top actions will be from the most common positions and will end in a One-Quarter Tag with a normal wave in the center and normal couples on the outside.

After lessons, you can dance anywhere in the world and attend square dance weekends and festivals for the rest of your life. Every June, a National Square Dance Convention is held with over 20,000 dancers attending each year.

## EDUCATIONAL TELEVISION BROADCAST OF SERIES OF SQUARE DANCE FILMS

Walt Cole，Chairman of the Callerlab Communications and Public Relations Committee，is happy to report that a series of films promoting Square Danc－ ing will be broadcast as a satellite uplink． Mr．George Arm of Seca，Columbia，SC and Mr．Larry Hall of South Carolina Educational Television，（WNSC－TV 30）， PO Box 11766，Highway 21 Bypass，Rock Hill，SC 29730，have produced and directed this series．The series will be uplinked in half hour segments for 26 con－ secutive weeks which began Saturday， October 5，1985，4：00 PM（Eastern Time） to all PBS stations at no charge to the receiving station．

This series consists of 26 one－half hour sessions showing a color－coordinated square learning the Mainstream Program． It depicts interviews with some caller／leaders and shows live dancers in a festival atmosphere．In some locations these films have been used as sup－
plemental instruction．When used to sup－ plement regular lessons，the retention rate was greater than without the film supplement．

## FACTS ON THE 1986 INDIANA CONVENTION

Where: Indianapolis, Indiana, site of the greatest spectacle in square dancing in the Hoosier Dome and the adjacent Indiana Convention Center.
When: June 26, 27, 28, 1986.
Who: An estimated 40,000 square dancers from all over the world.

Dancing: all levels of square, round and contra dancing and clogging from 9 a.m. to 11 p.m. all three days, with dancing in some halls until 1 a.m. Exhibitions under the glamorous Hoosier Dome and also in the main dance halls.
Education: 23 panels, 22 clinics and 5 seminars are planned, more than 100 hours of advice, instruction and insight.

Fashion: The theme of the Indianapolis fashion show will be "The Greatest Spectacle in Fashion". Centerpiece for the show will include "The greatest spectacle in racing" - a model of the Indianapolis

Motor Speedway.
Tours: A visit to Indianapolis would be incomplete without a peek at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway, scene of the Indy 500-Mile Race, and a look at the Speedway Hall of Fame Museum, displaying some of the greatest cars in racing history. A Speedway tour will be available to all convention goers. Other tours before, during and after the dancing, include the Indianapolis Children's Museum, largest in the worid and magic for children of all ages; Brown Country, where nature mimicks art and vice versa; Conner Prairie, a living museum where the year is always 1836; Madison, Indiana, a river town which historians and restorationists say shouid be fenced and left untouched in its historic quaintness; French Lick, site of Indiana's most notorious hotel and most explosive product, Pluto Water - "If nature can't, Pluto can," they once said; and Richmond, the city of roses and site of one of the largest rose-growing operations in the Midwest.
Housing: More than 2,000 rooms surround the Hoosier Dome, more will be opened by June 1986. Suburbs provide 9,000 more rooms, all within 20 minutes of the dancing. More than 7,000 room already are under contract. Campers have 2,200 special convention-time sites available, plus many spaces in the indianapolis area. Three universities in Indianapolis will provide dormitory housing.
Dining: Some 50 restaurants are within easy walking distance of the convention site and more will be opened by the summer of $86^{\prime}$; a gourmand magazine found (continued on page ${ }^{35}$ )

 (continued from page 33)85 restaurants of note in the city, 22 restaurants have been opened downtown in the last year. Fare ranges from continental dining to fast-food to sidewalk vendors. Limited food service will be provided in the convention center.

Travel: Four interstates reach Indianapolis - I-65, I-69, I-70, and I-74. In addition, I-80 and I-64 bring motorists to the Hoosier state. Two interstates come directly downtown and an interstate belt circles the city. There are 130 daily airline flights into Indianapolis. Limousine service is available. Indianapolis has a fullservice downtown helicopter port in the U.S. for those who want to arrive in style from the suburban airport. Within the city, travel includes taxis, buses, downtown trolleys and even horses and carriages.

Weather: In June, the Indianapolis temperature averages 71.7 degrees, with comfortable nights and sunny days (the rainfall for the month averages 4 inches). Relative humidity at mid-day averages 62 percent. Downtown, where the dancing
will be, is 712 feet above sea level; the highest point in town is 910 feet above sea level.

Sights: Any spot in Indiana - from spectacular caves in the south to frothy Lake Michigan in the north to the rambling Wabash River on the west, to King's Island (Disneyland of the Midwest) just across the eastern boundary - can be comfortably visited by car in one day. Both bus and walking tours show off Indianapolis. The city has three outstanding museums (historical, art, youthful fun), one of the few city markets surviving in its original form, the largest Scottish Rite temple in the world, a world-class zoo, four university campuses, Olympic-quality sites to swim or bicycle, and the largest developed city park in the nation.
