It was voted, after some discussion, to extend our Letter of Agreement with the Marriott for the years of 1990 and 1991, and the dates of the third weekend in September will be reserved for the Federation's Convention.

The Federation has decided to participate, in a coordinated effort, with each of the three districts to sell a book of tickets entitled "Entertainment 1986". ## I.R.S. MEMO FROM THE NATIONAL EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Federation received a memo from the National Square Dance Executive Committee regarding tax information and square dance clubs. The memo pointed out some areas concerning club tax problems: 1) A club needs an I.R.S. employer identification number if it has a checking account, savings account or certificate of deposit. Normally, the bank will request this when an account is being opened. 2) If a club does obtain an I.R.S. number, it must also file an application for exemption from income taxes on any of its receipts. 3) In addition, if a club pays any person or organization $\$ 600$ or more in a calendar year, the club is required to issue a 1099 tax report to the payee, and send a copy to the I.R.S. along with a 1096 form.
To get an I.R.S. employer number, form SS-4 must be filled out. This is relatively simple, and the Federation Treasurer, Frank Evans, has blank forms.

## I.R.S. MEMO FROM THE NATIONAL EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE (continued from page 7)

For a club to apply for exemption from federal income taxes, the I.R.S. form 1024 must be completed. This form has 7 pages and must be sent to the I.R.S. together with a copy of the club by-laws. Form 1024 may be obtained from your local I.R.S. office.

A club cannot use the I.R.S. number of the Federation.

## PATTERNS MADE EASY

For the first time, at the 35th Nat. S/D Convention, dress patterns will be given out in newspaper form ( 6 pgs ), and ready for the sewing room. The newspaper will have patterns on sleeves, bodices and skirts from size 8 to 20 ; also sewing tips and hints.

Demonstrations at the "Sew and Save Exhibition" will be given by experts from the Purdue University Home Economics Department. Along with tips for making S/D attire, the Purdue demonstrators will provide information on machine embroidery, appliques, seam finishing and the creation of men's "Smiley pockets", which have a slit opening in the shirt that looks like a smile and has no flaps.

The "Sew and Save"' area, which will be in operation every day of the convention (June 26-28, 1986), will feature several "Color Me Beautiful' seminars. Original dress designs will be displayed and some will be given away during the convention.

A highlight of the program on Saturday, June 28, will be a demonstration by Lee McCormick of Washington State. She is well known for her square dance patterns and designs and has appeared at many of the national square dance conventions.

## SEWING HINTS By Ruth Henderson

With the months of March and April upon us, our thoughts do indeed turn to Spring. I would hope if your sewing is of an ambitious nature, you would give some thought to creating a Spring/Summer wardrobe of square dance outfits.

Fabric stores should now be displaying
pastels and prints that would inspire us to leave the winter doldrums behind (square dancers never have these). If you have not been shopping for fabric yet, let's go with a few ideas.
Border Prints - there have been many of these available at stores and by vendors at conventions, which can be made into very attractive dresses. The skirt can be just about ready-made, with the border doing all that is necessary. The skirt can be full, by cutting it 4 yards around, then taking it in every 3 inches at the waist, and with $3 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ deep darts (gathered), you can eliminate the bulk at the waistline. The bodice and sleeves can be of a solid or small print to match the upper part, and with a bit of creativity, you can use the balance of the border material as trim for the neck and sleeve edges.
Combination Ideas - pick a coordinating solid and print, use the solid color for the bodice and sleeves and the print for the skirt. Make a sailor or shawl collar with the print, and add a band of trim around the sleeves and at the bodice.
Striped Fabrics - these can be designed several ways. The skirt can be cut on

a diagonal to give a " $V$ " effect, or it can be straight up and down with a long piece of material running horizontally around the skirt (about 4 inches up from the hemline). The horizontal effect can be used at the waist and on the sleeve edges, if you prefer.

Colorful Prints - tiered skirts, bias skirts with ruffles or just a full gathered skirt all look nice and present a feminine look. For the bodice, you may want to browse through pattern books and find an attractive, becoming top from a reguiar dress pattern and use that. Make sure it will be comfortable to move and dance in.

Hopefully, these ideas will inspire you to shop and sew, and make dressing the part for square dancing as much fun as the activity.

## LEGACY NEWS RELEASE

The word "turkey" conjures up different pictures, in different situations, and with different people. Most of us, in this country, probably envision a fat bird, roasted to a golden brown and full of delicious stuffing, sitting on a table surrounded by all sorts of good things to eat. Around the tabie are family and friends, and it's a time to remember how much we have to be thankful for.
Sometimes when a play or other presentation is a flop, it is referred to as a "turkey". When one breaks a bad habit, such as smoking, on his own by just suddenly quitting, we say, " He quit cold turkey". And the bird's name sometimes is taken in vain by some who refer to one they dislike as a "turkey". Some years ago, a very popular dance of the day was the "turkey-trot" - perhaps named after the ungainly gait of the bird. Is it any wonder that there once was a move afoot to name the turkey our national bird? After all, who ever heard of an "eagletrot"?

Ballroom dancing certainly has undergone many changes since the days of the "turkey trot". And square dancing has undergone many changes in choreography, from the simple visiting couples routines of the 1930's and '40's to the complex choreography of today.

However, the friendliness and pleasure of moving to the music in square dancing have provided a firm base, a constant, for the activity over these many years. Some feel we are in danger of losing that golden thread, that there is a lack of courtesy, too much rough dancing, and a snobbishness built on "levels" of dancing. Let us hope they are wrong. We can afford to give up some choreography, if necessary, without affecting square dancing a great deal, but we cannot afford to give up the friendliness and moving to the music.
We owe a great vote of thanks to the early pioneers of square dancing for establishing the spirit that has served the activity so well, for so long. It is appropriate that we tip our sombreros to them. Also appropriate is giving thanks for life in a free society where we can dance aimost any night of the week in schools, churches, recreation centers, granges and all sorts of other places without fear that some "big brother" may be watching.

## LEGACY SURVEY OF DANCER COMMENTS

Now that fall square dance classes are well along, and those beginner dancers, who are in it for the long pull have been identified, it might be a good time to measure our teaching efforts against the yardstick of dancer comments on the Legacy survey.
Dancers have consistently told us that beginners are being taught (or exposed) to too much, too fast, that a large number of spring graduates are not prepared to dance in their clubs and that there is too much rough and discourteous dancing. All of these things are correctible in a class which is of sufficient length and is well-taught.
Both callers/teachers and club officers should realize that a well-taught dancer is more apt, than a poorly-taught dancer, to find success and pleasure in the square dance world, and, therefore, is apt to be a longer term dancer. It is, indeed, short-sighted of callers/teachers to

(continued from page 23) graduate dancers who are almost certain to become confused, frustrated and drop out of square dancing. It is equally shortsighted for club officers to insist upon a hurry-up course of instruction and early graduation just to increase the size of a club and its treasury. What all teachers and club officers should be promoting in classes is the development of happy, long term dancers who will be contributing to the club for many years.

Legacy encourages all caller/teachers and club officers to teach not only the basic steps and maneuvers of square dancing, but also to take time to teach the beginning dancer proper styling, proper dress, courtesies of square dancing, history and heritage, club responsibilities and the other important, nonchoreographic subjects which contribute so much to the pleasure and friendliness of square dancing.

Daryl Clendenin, Chairman of the Callerlab Mainstream Quarterly Selection Committee, is pleased to announce that "Scoot Cross And Turn" is the Mainstream Quarterly Selection for the period beginning January 1, 1986.

## SCOOT CROSS AND TURN

By Johnny Wykoff
Starting Formation: Box Circulate Foursome or Parellel Ocean Waves with boys facing in. From right hand box, with the boys facing in and the girls facing out, All Scoot Back, Girls then pull by with right hands extending the left to the boys who reach back and to the right for a courtesy Turn. (Ends in Facing Lines if started in parellel waves, or ends in an Eight Chain Thru if started from columns). Timing: $10-12$ beats of music.

Singing Call Figure: Heads Square Thru, Dosado, Touch $1 / 4$, Scoot Cross And Turn, Pass The Ocean, Recycle, Swing The Corner, Promenade.

Useful modules from Eight Chain

Thru (Box 1-4): 1) Touch $1 / 4$, Scoot Cross And Turn, Flutterwheel, Slide Thru, equals zero; 2) Right and Left Thru, Touch $1 / 4$, Scoot Cross And Turn, and $1 / 4$ more, equals Swing Thru and the Boys Run; 3) Right and Left Thru, Touch $1 / 4$, Scoot Cross And Turn, Flutterwheel, equals Star Thru.
Typical Flgure: Heads Square Thru, Touch $1 / 4$, Scoot Cross And Turn, Courtesy Turn and $1 / 4$ more, Ladies Trade, Bend The Line, Star Thru, Pass To The Center, Square Thru $3 / 4$, Allemande. (Reminder: Ladies Trade \& Bend The Line are choreographically the same as Chain Down The Line).

Comments: Certainly the most popular position for dancer execution will be: From an Eight Chain Thru formation, Touch $1 / 4$, Scoot Cross and Turn. From this particular position, the courtesy turn is basically the same as in any Right and Left Thru. (Since the Callerlab membership has reaffirmed that a courtesy turn should only be executed when a boy turns a girl, the Box Circulate Foursome with boys facing in is the only allowable formation in the Mainstream Program). Doing a Scoot Cross and Turn from Right Hand Columns would seem to be a little more congested for the Courtesy Turn. The movement is quickly taught, and easily handled by Mainstream dancers.

Dance Examples: Patter - Heads Square Thru, Shuttle In, Pass Thru, Wheel and Deal, Girls Pass Thru, Shuttle Right, Bend the Line, $1 / 2$ Square Thru, Right \& Left Grand. Singer - Heads Right \& Left Thru, Square Thru, Dosado, Shuttle Out, Ends Fold, Double Pass Thru, Track II, Swing, Promenade.
