#### NEWS BULLETIN Submitted by Square Dancers of America, Inc.


We finally, after many conferences with Tournament of Roses Officials and our own committee people, have come to the decision that we will continue to work for a Square Dancers Float in the Annual Tournament of Roses Parade in Pasadena, CA.

This is the first of several bulletins we will release this year. It brings to you the news that "We don't owe anyone; we are in the clear for the first time since we started in October 1975 with nothing more than an idea." There is one hurdle remaining that must be crossed before we can say we are completely out of debt. We do owe John Fogg and Charles Naddeo some money. This money was advanced to pay for the first float by their mortgaging their homes. We know now it won't be as big a hurdle as it has been and with the help of all Square Dancers we can do it.

We were the recipients of a legacy, the

first of this year, from a former square dancer who wanted to do something for our world. She did attach a condition to it. We can only use the interest and then only to put a float in the parade. That is a nest egg that is deeply appreciated and will be used very wisely. Our controller has charge of making the best investment he can to get the best return. With this seed money the struggle won't be quite as hard as in years past (we hope).

In January of this year we started a series of dances for class people, new dancers and anyone else who wants to come and have fun with us. We do have a home now through the rest of this year and if we take good care of it, we'll be able to use it as long as we wish. These dances are for fun and relaxation of the student dancers and new graduates so that they may get the floor time they didn't get in class. The dances are held on the 3rd or 4th Sunday of each month and sometimes it's the 5th Sunday. Hours are 7:00-10:00 PM and are floor and class level. So far we have had good results and hope that it continues that way. All



the attending dancers have had a good time and they are all smiles as they leave. We have had three callers at each dance and plan on keeping the same format as long as they are gracious enough to keep volunteering. Someday though we will surprise them with some sort of renumeration. We try not to get the same callers too often because we don't want to take advantage of anyone.

September was a busy month for us. On the 14th, we danced on the grass in the outfield of Dodger Stadium when the Dodgers hosted the Cincinnati Reds. The 21st was our monthly dance and on the 27th, we did a demonstration at the Los Angeles Street Scene.

The Board of Directors decided to keep the drawing for the free trip to Pasadena going and the tickets should be out sometime soon. If we can find enough people to help, we are contemplating a country-wide automobile give-away as another fund raising operation. Our grant seekers have been hard at work and should have some letters in the mail to all sorts of foundations asking for help.

At one of our recent meetings we decided to return to the first rose color until we are back in the parade. The color is RED, RED, RED; so if anyone asks, the roses for now and next year are RED. Our president, with the first vice president, met with the chairman of admittances for the parade and were told that we were dropped from the '86 parade because of our financial position. All the stories and rumors that we had heard had no basis and nothing to do with it. We were also told that we would not make the '87 parade unless we had a miracle. The rules have been changed and if an applicant doesn't have at least fifty-thousand dollars in the bank, spendable, they won't make it. The lowest value of a float will be eighty-thousand dollars. So you see why we need you. The chances for our being in the '88 parade are better than even money, if we can get the money. All ideas, offers of help of any sort, especially people, will be greatly appreciated.

Our schedule of meetings has been revised so that we will now have a board of directors meeting every other month and a general committee meeting once a quarter except December. Hosting will be on a rotating basis at someone's home, officer or wherever.

Anyone wishing to join our dedicated group and get put to work should contact anyone wearing one of our badges. We need people to do paper shuffling, for information dissemination, to represent us for donation acceptance for roses, fund raising, committee work and anything else we can get you into.

The Square Dance Council of New Jersey proudly announces the "First New Jersey Square and Round Dance Convention" to be held on Saturday, March 14, 1987, at Trenton State College (four miles north of Trenton on Route 31) in Ewing Township, New Jersey.

Currently sending delegates are: Callers' Council of New Jersey, Dance Leaders of the Delaware Valley, Northern New Jersey Square Dancers Association, Central New Jersey Square Dance Association, Northern New Jersey Round Dance Leaders Council, and the Penn-Jersey District of the Federation of Delaware

Valley Square and Round Dancers.

In July 1982, after months of preparation, the above named organizations cosponsored a successful Baltimore (33rd N.S.D.C.) Booster Ball in Whiting, New Jersey. After this outstanding cooperative venture, the organizations continued to work together. Under the leadership of Frank & Helen Cavanaugh they were instrumental in spearheading passage of the bill in the New Jersey legislature that designed Square Dance as the American Folk Dance of New Jersey. A large outdoor dance on the capitol steps in Trenton celebrated this happy event.

Through the lines of communication established by these activities all of the organizations had input in designing the official square dance costume for New Jersey. After this series of events, it seemed logical and advantageous to keep the lines of communication open between these organizations.

Three years ago when the Council delegates formally adopted a constitution, the S.D.C.N.J. was officially "born." Although the education of dancers and leaders and state-wide publicity were, and still are, one of the Council's main concerns, when talk of a state-wide convention became serious, they seemed to be the logical organization to undertake this event.

Trenton State College with its excellent facilities, adjacent free parking and central location was chosen as the site for the convention. Three halls: Packer Hall (with two gyms and numerous smaller rooms including a dance studio), The Brower Student Center and the Student Recrea-



### WHAT'S THIS I HEAR ABOUT NEW CALLERLAB PROGRAMS? Submitted by Callerlab

For the past year or more, the square dance world has been very concerned about the many problems that seem to be plaguing the activity - high drop-out rates, reduced festival crowds, club-to-class transition problems, etc. Groups of leaders such as CROSSFIRE and CROSS-ROADS have met to discuss these concerns and seek solutions. Out of all of these meetings has come the thought that the current CALLERLAB Mainstream Program of 68 families of basics, with a suggested 41 teaching sessions of 2 to 21/2 hours each, may be longer than some areas can handle. An alternative entry level program that can be taught in 25 weeks has been widely suggested.

CALLERLAB has had one or more special committees studying these problems and possible solutions since its 1985 convention. The findings of the ad hoc committee were a major portion of the discussion topics at the 1986 convention in Baltimore, March 24-26. From the intensive work at the convention came a mandate to develop suitable entry programs with a shortened "Learn to Dance" time frame. These efforts are now underway with committees hard at work on solutions.

Let's look at the thrust of these efforts in an attempt to remove some of the misconceptions that some callers and dancers are talking about. There are four conditions:





#### WHAT'S THIS I HEAR ABOUT NEW CALLERLAB PROGRAMS? (continued from page 21)

1) Areas where the current Mainstream Program is alive and well -- NO CHANGE! There are many areas of the world where callers, clubs and leaders have been doing a fine job with existing dance programs and no changes are required. There is no need to tamper with a program that is alive and well and it would be presumptuous of CALLERLAB to intrude. To those of you who are operating in such an environment, we salute you and say, "Keep up the good work!"

2) Areas where Mainstream are the predominent dance program upon graduation -- A shortened Mainstream Program with fewer moves to be taught and learned in about 25 weeks, with other moved being deferred for subsequent workshopping. One of the major reasons for this is that many areas cannot devote 41 weeks to a learning cycle and 25 weeks seemed to be a good number for the instruction period. This was one of the major resolutions at Baltimore and the membership of CALLERLAB has been surveyed to determine which moves fall into which categories. Using the existing Mainstream Program as a starting point, the basics that can be taught effectively in 25 weeks would be commonly referred to as "Bold Face Type Basics" while those that can be deferred will be commonly described as "Italicized Face Type Basics." The proposed plan would be to teach the Bold Face Type Basics first in the 25 week class time. This means that having completed 25 learning sessions, dancers will have reached a destination where they can join clubs in their area using just these movements. Some areas may choose to workshop the deferred moves in subsequent dances of workshops. While some may view this primarily as a change in the teaching order it is really much more than that. In areas, the entire Mainstream list m covered over time. This trial program changes in italics may only be a shortened "Learn to Dance" lesson period. Other

(continued from page 23) areas will use the 25 week list of Bold Face Type Basics as a DESTINATION program, as indicated.

3) Areas where the predominent dance program includes some number of calls from the existing Plus Program -- A shortened Mainstream Program with fewer moves that can be taught in 25 weeks and which may include some number of Plus calls. Sometimes, dancers and callers use the term "Soft Plus" to describe this situation. There is a very select committee working on this proposal with a target date of late summer for the proposed list of calls. It should be emphasized that this, too, is a DESTIN-ATION program and not a stepping stone. This program will also be designed to be taught effectively in 25 weeks. Graduates of these classes then would be able to dance with clubs in their area using the figures taught in this 25 week program. this should reduce the trauma of classto-club transition since the class will have learned what will be danced upon graduation.

4) The fourth concurrent effort is called "Community Dance Program" and it is geared toward a limited repertoire of calls that can taught effectively in a 6 week time frame. It is emphasized that this, too, is a DESTINATION program and not a stepping stone to some other existing programs. This 6 week program is under the development auspices of the Traditional Dance Committee and will draw heavily on the rich heritage of America's traditional dance plus material from successful limited Basic programs. It is geared for those people who do not wish to devote their time and energies to learning the Mainstream Program in any of its existing or proposed forms, but rather want a system of social outlets for recreation and exercise. Many people who enter this program may subsequently gain greater interest and move to one of the other programs listed above, but this program is a complete program by itself. This is not designed for the current club dancers.

As these programs are completed, callers and dance leaders will be advised and they will be made available to ALL interested persons through CALLER-LAB Home Office, Box 679, Pocono Pines, PA 18350. It should be emphasized repeatedly that NONE OF THESE PROPOSED PROGRAMS IS DESIGNED TO REPLACE THE CURRENT MAIN-STREAM PROGRAM IN AREAS WHERE IT IS NOW WORKING. Indeed there are many areas where Mainstream is "alive and well" and no changes should be considered. To repeat an often used expression -- "IF IT AIN'T BROKE, DON'T FIX IT."

It also needs to be stressed that no program will work magic. It is not the pieces of paper that cause problems, but rather the callers and dance leaders that use or fail to use the designed programs. By working together for a common good, we will be able to strengthen the entire movement of square dancing in all of its forms. People can and do make the difference. Let's make it work for ALL of us!


