

### FEDERATION NEWS by Marguerite Scadding

A Federation board meeting was held at the Dunfey City Line Hotel on January 8, 1987 with 66 people in attendance.

President Bill Manuel called the meeting to order; in a little over an hour much business was covered. Some of the items discussed were:

Treasurer Frank Evans reported balances on December 31, 1986 of \$281.36 in the checking account and \$21,246.21 in the money market fund.

Total membership in the Federation at the moment is 2,617.

Registrations are being taken for the Wildwood Weekend scheduled for May 1-3, 1987.

A check for \$5,598.25 has been sent to cover our insurance under the United Square Dancers of America. It should be understood that dancers are not covered until fees are received by the insurance company.

Chairman of the 27th Convention Joe & Betty Mathers have appointed all chairmen for the various committees. The Federation is advancing \$1,000.00 to the committee to start its work.

Roy & Marion Goerlich will take the Showcase of Ideas to the 36th National Convention in Houston for the Federation. Copies of the publications from the three districts and a copy of each convention program from the past 25 years will be part of the Showcase.

The Federation's AC300 amplifiers have been fully repaired. Starting in 1987, one amplifier will be replaced every other year. This will be completed in 1995. As this is done, the amplifier being replaced will be for sale.

The Federation will make a bid at the National Convention in Anaheim in June 1988 to have the National Convention in Philadelphia in 1992. The committee seeking a general chairman is as follows: Chairman Nancy & Clayton Kerns, John & Kathy Falter, John & Betty Schapperle, Clyde & Mary Ryerson and Doug & Ethel Vollmer. Resumes of candidates must be submitted to the committee prior to March 8, 1987. The committee is confident the considerations necessary for a successful convention in Philadelphia can be achieved.

An exciting offer has come to Joan Niemczak of the Rainbow Cloggers. Russia, under the Youth Ambassador Exchange Program and Germany, under the International Folk Festival have invited the young people in her group to perform in these countries. It will cost \$1,000.00 per child for transportation; once there the Russian and German governments will take care of the expenses. The children are looking for ways to earn the money; it is hoped that companies, clubs, etc. will support this project; therefore, her appeal to the Federation. The children are from Pennsylvania, New Jersey and Delaware.

Hopefully, we will have some members from the 1987 Federation Committee attending to tell you all about the convention.


We should also have a square of dancers with the newly proposed state square dance outfits.
