average - 16½.
Advanced 1: 6 hours of dancing programmed. Squares per hall: high - 13; low - 4; average - 7 .

Advanced 2: 21 hours of dancing programmed. Squares per hall: high - 28; low - 2; average - 16.

Challenge 1: 19 hours of dancing programmed. Squares per hali: high - 7; low - 0; average - $41 / 2$.

Challenge 2: 7 hours of dancing programmed. Squares per hall: high - 3; low - 0; average - $11 / 2$.

Rounds Only: 28 hours of dancing programmed. Couples per hall: high - 74; low - 15; average - 36.
$2 \times 2$ Rounds: 16 hours of dancing programmed. Couples per hall: high - 50; low - 7; average - 23.

These figures show an increase in Plus and Advanced dancers over the 1986 Convention with other levels relatively static. The Program Chairman for Square
and Round Dancing will try to make their schedules reflect the needs of the dancers attending the Convention. For this reason it is important that you indicate on your Registration Form the dance level you prefer.
