## LEGACY SURVEY

In 1987, Legacy published a survey from information obtained from square
and round dancers. The results of this survey will be published in successive issues of "Squares and Rounds". The following point of interest is where these surveys came from and how many returns were received.

Survey Forms Processed: in 1980 2,077 ; in 1982-4,280; in 1983-5,481; in 1985-7,584; and in 1987-4,227.

Dancer Profile Expanded: location, experience, frequency, role (other than dancer), dance program, reading, workshops, and round dancing.

Information and Opinions: club lessons and membership, leadership information, and attitude (continued).

This information has been compiled from Legacy survey forms. Distribution was not controlled and the results (as in all previous surveys) may contain sampling and other errors. Percentages are rounded off to the closest whole number. "No answers" and "multiple answers" will, in some cases, mean that percentages will not necessarily total $100 \%$. ## FEDERATION NEWS UPDATE

## Paul \& Evelyn Lofurno Publicity Chairmen

The Mid-East Penn District reported a membership of 898 . Two new Round Dance Clubs have applied for membership and their acceptance was recommended by the Executive Board. The district's Dance for the Handicapped will have already been held by the time you read this release.

The Pen-Del District reported a very successful Half-Way Dance. They also held a caller/cuer panel discussion at their April 17th meeting. It was an open meeting, which proved beneficial to people from outside the district as well. PenDel has already scheduled their Annual Dance-To-See for October 9, 1988. That's always a good one.

The PennJersey District sadly announced the passing of their chairman, Clyde Ryerson. Clyde and his wife Mary, were very active workers. They were chairmen of the 1983 Delaware Valley Convention and active participants in running several other conventions.

The recently reorganized Bucks-Trenton District has initiated a new "Dance Around Program" to replace the former

Summer Dances. All new graduates will be supplied with free tickets to dances held by each district club. This will provide newcomers with an opportunity to dance with different callers and different experienced dancers. Sounds like a promising program.

Following the district reports, discussion was held on the location for our September 1989 Convention. Based on costs, facilities available, etc. the Brandywine Resort was again selected.

The Federation is seeking a Public Relations person. Anyone with background in this type of activity who might be interested should contact the Federation President. There is also a need for a Li-brarian-type person to serve as Federation Archives Chairman. There is an abundance of material that needs to be organized so that a true history of the Delaware Valley Federation can be produced.

As you know, the Federation is making a bid to have the 1992. National Convention held in Atlantic City. Bill \& Doris Manuel have finished the monumental task of preparing the bid books (a requirement when presenting a bid) and did a magnificent job. Copies were available for examination by all present at the meeting.

Bill \& Doris Manuel modeled the proposed costumes to be worn by our members at this year's National Convention in Anaheim, CA. This costume is to be worn in lieu of a state costume, since our organization is a multi-state unit.

Roger Owings discussed the Federation's insurance program. He stated that two types of coverage (Liability and Personal Injury) are carried and pointed out the fact that even if all members of a club are insured at other clubs, that club must pay the minimum of $\$ 25.00$ in order to have the very important liability coverage. This is the coverage which protects a club in the event that a law suit is filed against them. (Certificates of insurance coverage should only be requested when the owner of the hall specifically requests one.)

Roger also emphasized the importance of reporting changes in dance location ahead of time. Many clubs are neglecting to do this.

## TRIMMING TIPS

Since trimming can be the most expensive part of making a dress, here are some budget-wise ideas to remember.

Save your scraps. Scrap pieces can be used as appliques or sewn together in strips to use for ruffles or banding.
Rick-rack or bias tape can be sewn in rows to make a rainbow of color or as color-fast ribbons. (Always test the washability first before using rick-rack or bias tape.)
Lace or eyelet edging (purchased in quantity or on sale) can be used to trim a dress as lavishly as desired.
Rows of decorative stitching, either by hand or by machine, can make a lovely addition to any dress.
Painting your own trim on a dress can be very fun. Tri-Chem and Vogart are just two fabric paints available in stores. They can be used just like felt tip markers. (Do not use felt tip markers unless they are marked "waterproof" as they will run.) Always test the paint on scrap material first for ease of application and then wash it - only then use it on your dress. Acrylic paints are also good for hand-painting your dress. Do plenty of experimenting first to be sure of the desired result.
