## RUTHIE'S SEWING BASKET

by Ruth McLay

Button, button, who's got the button?
When applying buttons to a garment, remember that buttons are an important addition. They must be placed properly and sewn on correctly or they could pucker, gap or droop and ruin your garment.

There are two types of buttons, shankless and those with a shank. Shankless buttons are flat and work well on thin fabrics or as decoration. Shank buttons are made with a shank. They should be positioned so that the shank parallels the button hole and then attached with small stitches.

The size of the button is important. Choose a size in proportion to the type of garment and the size of the person wearing the garment. Large buttons do not flatter a tiny person and vise versa.

When sewing on buttons the thread should match the fabrics weight and color. Although, ordinary thread is fine for sewing on most buttons. Button hole twist can be used on heavy fabrics. Only use about 16 inches of thread at a time to avoid knots.

Place buttons at stress points to prevent the garment from gapping - for example, the fullest part of the bustline. Be sure that the buttons match up with the
button holes perfectly before you sew them into place to avoid gaps and puckers. Sew them on one at a time, from top to bottom, and button each button as it is completed to be sure it is correctly placed.

Buttons can be reinforced by placing a smaller flat button on the back (wrong side) of the garment under the larger outer button. Sew one button to the other with the fabric between them. Buttons on light-weight fabric can be reinforced by folding a piece of seam binding and sewing it under the button on the back (wrong side) of the fabric.

These are but a few hints concerning buttons. Hopefully, they will be helpful to you all.

Teaching Hints: The action for the

Sides begins like Grand Square. Callers will say, "Sides face, Gran d Sweep." In the Heads part, when the $d$ ancers do the Pass Thru, they should move forward far enough so that the Partner Trade takes place in the Sides position.

Singing Call: Sides face, Grand Sweep! (Callers may wish to sing or direct the action.)

Current Mainstream Quarterly Selections are: Hang A Right (Left), Cloverflo and Grand Sweep.
