## RUTHIE'S SEWING BASKET

I trust that everyone had a pleasant holiday season. And now that 1990 is here, once again we'll get down to new and old routines.

It's good to know your own figure (gals and guys, too) when making your own garments.

Measurements are important! A dress or skirt that hangs loose fits as poorly as one that is to tight. And a dress or skirt that is too long detracts from the beauty of the garment as well as one that is too short. A gapping neckline is also uncomfortable. Square dance clothing should feel good, fit properly and be comfortable while dancing. A well-fitted dress makes you feel like the prettiest gal at the dance. So...come on gals (guys, too) take your measurements! Then hide them after you are through sewing if you'd like -
but take them!
Measurements taken should be compared with standard pattern measurements. If yours falls within the patterns listings, you will not have any problems. If they don't, then get a pattern with the closest listings and make adjustments on the pattern accordingly. And fit the pattern well before cutting out your material, allowing for movement.

A few simple alterations on your pattern will save a lot of ripping out and expedite your sewing.

dance leader associations, publishers, record companies, suppliers, special groups (singles, youth, handicapped, campers, overseas dancers, tour leaders, caller's schools, vacation institutes, etc.) and various national societies and foundations. Square dance, in this context, is a generic term that includes round dance, contras, clogging, heritage and country dance.
Trustees, as the delegates would be called, would meet every two years to exchange ideas and formulate goals, for promotion, protection and perpetuation of the activity. Committees would function continuously, coordinating useful programs and offering assistance as needed. The objective would be to operate as a lea-dership-service-advisory organization, with open channels of communication to and from all square dance organizations.
Legacy I, held in Cleveland, Ohio, in 1973, outlined specific areas of concern - leadership training, communication, organization, standardization, square dance image, heritage education, ethics and attitudes, and business aspects.
Legacy's accomplishments in these areas during its 16 years of operation has been most impressive. 1) Establishment of local leadership programs (Mini Legacies), production of manuals to improve leadership skills, and leadership seminars at National Conventions. 2) Maintenance of a national "Hot Line" and "Dancer/ Answer Lines" in every state and most
provinces. 3) Maintenance of mailing lists of associations and publications. 4) Establishment of the National Association of Square and Round Dance Suppliers and Roundalab. 5) Assistance to solo groups, youth and handicapped. 6) Support and endorsement of Callerlab in its establishment of Quarterly Selections as a controlled trial process for new movements, and reduction of the complexity and number of basics for a more realistic mainstream program. 7) Measurement of the dancing population and its opinions and desires through National Surveys. 8) Endorsement of the Code of Ethics, guidelines for proper attire, non-alcoholic and non-competitive status. 9) Promotion of heritage awareness, displays and demonstrations to celebrate the U.S. Bicentennial in 1976. 10) Coordination of September as Square Dance Month and production of "Promo-Kits" and "New Dancer Notes". 11) Development of guidelines for sound fiscal practices in square dance organizations.

## CAMPERS ENCOURAGED TO COME TO THE 39TH NATIONAL

Both Memphis Mayor, Dick Hackett and Shelby County Mayor, Bill Morris, were impressed with the large number of campers attending the 38th National in Oklahoma City and want to provide adequate facilities for the 39th National in Memphis in June, 1990. The number of proposed sites with electrical service was increased from 500 to 1,000 (prvided there are 1,000 RV registations by December 31, 1989). The camping facilities being built by the county expressly for the 39th National will be located at the AgriCenter International, which is approximately 15 miles from the Memphis Convention Center Complex.

The campground will be serviced by express shuttle busses. The fee for the use of the busses is $\$ 10.00$ per person in advance and $\$ 12.00$ per person after May 1, 1990. This fee is not included in the price of the RV site rental.

The 39th National campground will be

open to accept dancers at 7:00 a.m. on June 25, 1990 and will remain open until noon on July 1, 1990. Dancers who have registered and paid the fee for an RV site will be able to pick up their convention registration packet, along with any merchandise purchased from the form, at the campground upon arrival.

The campers will have access to water from spigots placed stategically around the campground which will have 100 ft . hoses attached. There will not be individual water connections. Two shower facilities will be provided - one for men and one for women. Each shower facility will have ten stalls. There will be dump facilities at the campground, and a "honey wagon" will be available for a nominal fee for those who don't want to move their rigs.

For all sites above the number which are registered by December 31, 1989, the county will provide a site to park the rigs. These campers will have access to water, showers and the dump station but will not have electrical service.

All campers wished to camp together as a group should gather somewhere and arrive at the campground together. Space does not permit a staging area at the campground, and all parking will be done sequentially based on check-in order.

Directions to the campground, along with some recommendations as to locations for groups to meet, and the CB channel which the campground will monitor will be forwarded to all who register and reserve a site.

Campers, be sure to register by December 31, 1989 to ensure that sufficient sites with electrical service will be provided.
