## EDUCATION REPORT

Did you ever wonder about the origin of the names of some of our square dance calls? The following is excerpted from an article entitled, "Dancing Tips" by Harold \& Lili Bausch which appeared in the November 1989 issue of "American Squaredance" magazine.
...Allemande Left comes from the French, and it means all round, by the left. Sashay means to side step. Ladies Chain is obvious, and Square Thru is from the square which is formed. California Twirl at that time in California was called Frontier Twirl.

Trade By is explained simply as, outsiders trade as insiders pass by. Ferris Wheel is a take off of Wheel and Deal.

Dixie Style to an Ocean Wave developed from the Dixie Chain where the gentleman placed his lady in front, and they proceeded to chain. Someone came up with the idea to halt the action halfway through the chain so that the man kept ahold of the woman's left hand and joined hands with the other man to make a lefthanded wave. This became more popular than the original call to Dixie Chain.

Teacup Chain, one of the most popular calls, was invented for exhibition dancers on a table using teacups...

There were others, but we felt that these were the most interesting to share with you.

## RUTHIE'S SEWING BASKET

by Ruth McLay

Here is a fairly new idea - continuous sewing. Perhaps you would like to try it.

Let's learn continuous sewing! Sew all the facings, darts, underarm seams, etc. in one continuous strip, only connected by several stitches. You may sew as many seams as necessary, then cut the pieces apart.

Now you are ready for a "pressing" session. Try using a so called "security blanket" when ending a seam. Use a scrap of firm fabric measuring $1^{\prime \prime} \times 3$ ". Stitch across this "blanket" at the end of each seam group. Then, cut away this "security blanket" from the previous garment pieces after you have started a new seam. You can help speed your sewing along if you: (1) eliminate holding the thread - avoid machine jamming; (2) do not raise and lower presser foot frequently ; (3) eliminate cutting off long thread ends - making sewing neater; (4) never let your needle come unthreaded; and (5) you can save a lot of thread if you follow steps \#3, \#4 and \#5.

Using a "security blanket" will give you a chance to check the stitch setting before you start sewing. If the needle point is dull or damaged you will first discover it on scrap fabric rather than on your expensive dress fabric. It also helps for a better start when you have to begin your seam at the very edge.

I hope these ideas have been helpful to you all.
