## EDUCATION REPORT

by Bob \& Charlotte Goerlich

The following statements were exerpted from articles by Bill Heimann and Barry Claspar in Callerlab's "Guidelines", Volume XVI, Summer 1989; and they bring into sharp focus some observations about today's square dancers.

1) Good dancers help others.
2) It is not necessary for a dancer to move into more complex programs to be considered a good dancer.
3) Dance problems are caused by dancers who move into a more complex program before mastering their current program.
4) The most help a dancer can give to another dancer is to do his or her own part of the call perfectly. Be precise in doing each part of the call; end facing the correct direction, have perfect timing as the caller directs the action, leave out all actions not officially part of the call's definition, be quiet and keep listening intently.
5) The next best way to help is for the good dancer to do so silently without

touching the dancer being helped. Use hand, head and facial signals, or turn shoulders and hips as he or she helps the erring dancer hold a position, correct a facing direction or move into the spot for the next call. Above all, don't talk, be silent.
6) Only as a last resort should the skilled dancer physically move the erring dancer. In fact, most of the time it is preferable to let the square break down and re-group rather than cause the confusion, resentment and negative attitudes that sometimes occur when one dancer grabs, turns, pulls or pushes another. There are times when this type of help actually causes more errors!
Especially at this time of the year when we will soon be having new dancers on the floor, it might be well to keep the above guidelines in mind to help the new dancer make a smooth transition from recent graduate to experienced dancer.

## DO-SI-DOHIO:

## SQUARE DANCE MAY BE OURS

A state senator from southern Ohio has introduced a toe-tappin' bill that would add the square dance to the growing list of "official" state things.

Senator Cooper Snyder, R-Hillsboro, proposes making the square dance the official American folk dance of Ohio. Asked if his bill would place the square dance in the same category as the cardinal, the state bird, Snyder said, "I think it would put (it) ahead of the cardinal because there are more square dancers in Ohio than there are cardinals."

## SAVE ME, PLEASE!

Is your club prepared to handle an emergency situation? Are you?

By the time an emergency situation occurs it is too late to start thinking about what should be done, by whom, etc. By giving some thought and a little preparation to emergency procedures for your club and facility, the life you save may be your own.

To help your club become better prepared for most emergencies, the Federation of Delaware Valley Square \& Round Dancers has appointed a committee, entitled the Emergency Preparedness Committee (EPC), to discuss this topic.

EPC's members include: Chairperson, Elaine M. Wasekanes (215-237-8269), Caller/Cuer Contact, Dave Brown (302-834-2099), Sam \& Peggy Brubaker, Chet \& Shirley Lightcap, John \& Marianne Ortals and Ed Wasekanes.

What follows are suggestions of the EPC:

First, the Federation will be furnishing each club president with an emergency preparedness packet. Read the information, fill out the forms and share the information with your club members and your facility.

Second, each club should review or locate the following:

1) The Emergency Call for Medical Aid (ECMA) - copies and explanations are in your emergency preparedness packet.
2) The location of the nearest telephone at your facility/facilities.
3) A plan of action if your facility does not have a telephone.
4) Where emergency telephone numbers are kept.
5) The address of your facility and the closest cross streets.
6) Find out who in your club has current first-aid training and/or CPR training.
7) Fire extinguishers - where they are, what kind they are and how to use them.
8) The location of the nearest hospital.
9) The location of any first-aid kits. (This committee is not recommending that clubs purchase a first-aid kit.) Any emergency requiring more than ice or a bandaid will require a call for trained emergency personnel. But, if there is a firstaid kit available your first-aider might need it. Band-aids are always good to have on hand.

In addition, our committee recommends participation of all square dancers in CPR and first-aid training.

Next, in your emergency procedure packet will be a request that each club assign an Emergency Coordinator (EC). This person "should not" be your club's first-aider. The EC's job is to make sure that the only thing the first-aider has to worry about is the victim. The EC will:

1) Identify the nature of the emergency.
2) Inform the caller/cuer of what is happening, and have him/her locate and direct any first-aiders to the victim.
3) If the situation warrants it, make sure emergency calls are made. Since your EC has other responsibilities, the EC should not make the calls, just make sure it has been done.
4) Help the caller/cuer decide what should be done with dancers. (e.g. clear the hall, continue dancing, etc.)
5) Assist the caller/cuer in crowd control. make sure nothing impedes the firstaiders assistance to the victim.
6) Keep the caller/cuer informed of what is happening so that he/she can in turn keep the dancers informed. (e.g., A dancer has been hurt, first-aid is being given, an ambulance is on the way. Please stay clear and do not interfere.)
7) Inform your District Insurance Chairman about an incident as soon as possible.
8) If you are not going to be at a dance/ class, assign someone else to do your job and make sure they know what they are supposed to do.

9) Lastly, review the EMCA at your dances/classes on a regular basis. Make sure all members, students, club callers and cuers are familiar with EMCA and your club's emergency procedures.

Furthermore, additional sugguestions have been made to the Federation and to the caller and cuer organizations in order that they too are better prepared for possible emergencies.

The EPC sincerely hopes that all of the preparation recommended will never have to be used, but it is the goal of the committee that if an emergency does occur that all members of the Federation will be prepared to the best of their ability. In an emergency, time is very precious and being prepared may mean the difference between life and death for yourself or someone you love.

Take the time to be prepared, life is too precious for what if's!

The committee will be glad to help your club in setting up your emergency plan. If you have any suggestions, please call any of the afore mentioned members.

At age 91, he clearly illustrates that giving has no age boundary. Mr. Fairbanks not only gives freely of his money, but also of his time. For 20 years, he has been a volunteer reading tutor at the old Nockamixon Elementary School and currently at the Durham-Nockamixon Ele-
mentary School.
"I read in the paper how poorly students are educated," Fairbanks told the school board at a recent meeting. "We blame it on the teachers, but I feel that's unfair. I hope I can be a help in fixing that."

The Palisades School Board and the faculty thanked Mr. Fairbanks over and over again. We would like to add our thank you to the list.

On the inside of the front cover of each book is a stamp noting the donor's name. We anticipate that not only will students refer to the books to assist them in their education, but they will also be reminded of an individual's high regard for public education.

From a man who gives all he can with heart and soul, it is quite touching that the school district staff presented the $\$ 4,000$ worth of books to students on Valentine's Day.

Palisades staff and students are fortunate to have William Fairbanks among them. Yet his impact extends well beyond any school district boundaries. (bjr)

## ROUND DANCING AT THE 39TH NATIONAL CONVENTION

Round dancers, consider this your special invitation to attend the 39th Na tional Convention. For those who come in early, Trail-in Round Dances are scheduled as follows: June 24, Memphis Rainbow Rounds, June 25, Merry-Go-Rounds, and June 26, Rebel Roundabouts.

The official program will start on Wednesday night with a trail-end dance at the Cook Convention Center at 8:00 p.m. It will be cued by area round dance leaders and will feature popular dances phaserated I-V.

Each day of the convention will start with a Showcase of Rounds from 9:00 to 10:30 a.m., where the dances to be taught that afternoon will be shown. On Thursday and Friday the Showcase will be shown from the Ellis Auditorium stage with comfortable theater seating for the spectators. On Saturday the Showcase will be held in the convention center proper.

There will be three round dance halls with a total of 30,000 square feet. These
rooms will be used for the afternoon workshops and the evening programmed dances and after parties.

Round dance workshops will be held simultaneously from 1:00 to $5: 00$ p.m. in the Phase I/II and Phase III/IV Halls and from 1:00 to 5:30 p.m. in the Phase V/VI Hall. Reviews will start at 7:00 p.m. in the rooms where the dances were taught. Programmed dancing will start at 8:00 p.m. and end at 11:00 p.m. in each hall.

Phase I and II will be located in the Lower Level Exhibition Room at the south end of Ellis Auditorium. This hall will feature eight 30 minute teaches each day. The Phase III and IV Hall will be in the East Mezzanine Room at the south end of Ellis Auditorium. There will be six 40 minute teaches in this hall each day. All after parties will be held in this hall from 11:00 p.m. to 12:30 a.m. each night. The Phase V and VI Hall will be located at the Peabody Hotel in the Tennessee Ballroom. Workshops will be from 1:00 to 5:30 p.m. with three 90 minute teaches each day.
The Memphis Convention Center Complex, which includes Ellis Auditorium, is about one-half mile from the Peabody Hotel. Shuttle buses will depart each location every 15 minutes. There will be no problem getting from one location to the other. The Tennessee Ballioom is a new addition to The Peabody at the south end and is connected to the hotel proper at the mezzanine level. All these halls have either vinyl or terrazzo tile flooring.
