
TIK-TOK ROUNDS: We do not dance during the summer, so see you at our first dance in October.

ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS ABOUT USDA INSURANCE

- 1) 100% of club registered membership at time of payment.
- 2) Complete roster of membership, plus a list of class members.
- 3) All clubs have to pay the minimum fee (\$25.00) in order to participate in the liability coverage of insurance. Note: not extra, but the minimum.
- 4) If alcohol is present, the insurance in voided.
- 5) All activities under the club sponsorship must be registered with the District Insurance Chairman.
- 6) 30 days notice is required for demonstrations and exhibitions. All participants must be members of the insurance program.
- 7) Any change in address or time must have 30 days notice. 45 days if a certificate is required.
- 8) Picnics, pool parties and the like can be covered with one-day term insurance, cost \$250.00 and up.

NEW LEGACY LOGO

A new Legacy logo have been created, thanks to Stan Burdick, one of the three founders of Legacy in 1973. Stan and Cathie Burdick are now co-chairmen of Legacy, the International Leadership/Communications Organization of Square Dancing.

Stan created the new design as well as the original design. "The inspiration for this new logo came from Doc Tirrell, a former co-chairman," Stan said, "as well as from other trustees at the 1989 Reno Conclave."

It should be noted that this emblem nicely embodies the purpose of Legacy. The primary focus is the dancing couple. and bold shapes around them suggest square dancing, round dancing and contra dance (lines). Above the lettering is a gavel, symbol of leadership. Within the gavel handle are ten dots that stand for the ten components of Legacy - square dancers (individually), square dance organizations, caller organizations (local), Callerlab (international), round dance teachers organizations, National Square Dance Convention, square dance publications, record companies, square dance suppliers, foundations and special interest groups and projects.

Finally, a quill (part of the "y" of Legacy) suggests communication and promotion of the activity. As an aside, Stan mentioned that the ten dots could also signify that the 10th Legacy Conclave will be held in 1991 in May in Milwaukee, WI. Details of this event will soon be pub-
