## RUTHIE'S SEWING BASKET

Hopefully everyone has enjoyed their vacations and are ready to get back into the swing of square dancing.

The following are a few money-saving suggestions to keep your accessories looking like new.

So often, petticoats become limp.

Perhaps you would like to give them new life. Here are a few tips:

Try using Elmer's glue (3 oz.) mixed with three quarts of water for your final dipping after washing your petticoat. Then arrange it over an open umbrella to dry. Or, after washing your petticoat, try dipping it in Futura acrylic floor wax (enough to cover the size of your petticoat). Then arrange it over an open umbrella to dry.

If you don't like the afore mentioned tips, try sewing monofilament fish line ( 30 lb. test) on each tier of your petticoat. To make sewing easier, sew the fish line on bias tape and run through each tier.

As a money saver for making belts, try using plastic from a gallon bleach bottle. Cut strips to the desired width and zigzag stitch together - do not overlap. Then, cover with desired material. Cumberbunds can also be made in the same fashion.

If your shoes are getting scuff marks on them, try touching them up with a colored crayon to match.
