## RUTHIE'S SEWING BASKET

by Ruth McLay

If you are lacking experience in making men's western shirts, here are a few hints.

First, choose a nice basic western shirt pattern. Next, get your partner to put on one of his best fitting shirts and look at where the cuffs hit and how they fit, and also how the shoulders fit. Then, take the time to measure your partner accurately.

Study a well-made shirt for details in
sewing, such as interfacing. And keep in mind what a good shirt should look like and then add the following touches.

1. Pin small tucks in the pattern to take out unnecessary fullness if your partner is slender. Then cut out a new pattern.
2. Compare your pattern with the ready-made shirt. Do a lot of pin fitting first.
3. Use iron-on interfacing on the cuffs, collar and pocket flaps. Also use interfacing where the snaps will be placed, usually down front.
4. The final touch will be the snaps. Place them evenly and match them up.

For extra details, you can use piping around the yokes and cuffs. Try cutting on the bias from firm plaid fabrics for added style.

Also, you can use overcast hems instead of turned. This is done on the finest shirts, as cuffs are less bulky when overcast.
