## INSURANCE FOR 1991

Club Liability and Medical Insurance will be due on January 1, 1991.

Here are a few key reminders to consider about club insurance: 1) The fee remains the same at $\$ 2.00$ per person. 2) All members ( $100 \%$ ) of a club must be signed up and the club roster on file with the Insurance Chairman. 3) If a dancer belong to more than one club, members need only pay one fee, but must be starred on the second roster in-
dicating multiple membership. 4) Class members are automatically covered by insurance but do not have to pay the fee. Their class rosters must be on file. 5) Clubs with less than two squares ( 16 persons) as members must pay the club minimum fee of $\$ 30.00$, which insures the club for liability damage.

So, dance in 1991 safely and without financial worries to spoil the fun and pleasure of square and round dancing.

BMI and ASCAP are organizations which try to protect the copyrights of artists. Many callers, cuers and clubs received a letter from BMI (Broadcast Music Incorporated) asking for fees for using copyright materials. Legally, the promoters of the dance (which may be the caller, cuer, club and/or the owner of the building) are responsible for the fees. Callerlab and Roundalab have entered into negotiations with BMI. The purpose of the negotiations is to ensure that callers and cuers who belong to Callerlab and Roundalab will be covered, and will be licensed.

In light of the above, and at this writing, we do not know what the final costs will be for the callers and cuers for the licensing under BMI/ASCAP. We have

## RAINBOW STROLLERS AND RAINBOW ROUNDS

In 1976 this club, founded by Sam \& Dolores Procopio, became the first square and round dance club, and the Procopio's the first caller/cuer team in Berks County. (They also founded "Star Rounds", the first round dance club in Berks County, which merged with the Rainbow Club.)

With a membership of $100+$, in which singles are welcome and romances have bloomed - some even led to marriage many "firsts" have emerged. And, they are sponsoring their 15 th consecutive square dance class, sharing their joy in dancing.

Since its inception, the club has publicly honored through newspaper articles and a dance, callers and cuers who have helped the activity prosper. March 22, 1991 is the 14th Callers and Cuers Recognition Night, to be held at the Berks County Vo-Tech West Center, the clubs usual dance location. This event attracts up to 30 squares of dancers.

Nor are the dancers forgotten. The 16th Annual Grand Square Awards Night will be held in May to pay tribute to those who have made significant, positive contributions to the activity.

The Strollers have done numerous charity benefits. Last April, for example, their 2nd Annual Muscular Dystrophy Dance raised $\$ 909.00$. They enjoy a very full schedule year-round, changing to their summer location - Nativity Lutheran Church, 13th \& Amity Streets, Reading, PA - in June. 2nd and 4th Fridays, 8:15 to $10: 45$ p.m., are their dance dates.

The Strollers delight in being called a "fun" club to visit, for their special theme nights include not just decorations and snacks, but at a "Polka Party" for instance, all singing calls are familiar polka songs. For a change of pace, visit them for an "Italian Party", "Hobo Night" or whatever else they can dream up!

In 1980, the club honored the Procopio's for their promotion of square and round dancing in Berks County. Then in

1990, presented them with a plaque for "exceptional work, dedication and enthusiasm" as caller and cuer.

# RUTHIE'S SEWING BASKET 

by Ruth McLay

Listed below are a few steps that may help to make your sewing a little easier and more enjoyable.

- First of all, make sure your sewing machine is in good condition by keeping it clean (dust free) and oiled.
- Always have your ironing board handy when sewing - a trick used by famous designers - and keep it covered with a one-inch thick pad. Almost all materials can be pressed without seam ridges or dart ridges showing.
- If you are using slippery material when sewing, try pinning a towel over the end of your sewing machine to prevent the material from sliding.
- When sewing keep darts lying in their correct direction with seams open.
- When making ruffles, make them twice the width of the piece they will be sewed to.
- Easy-Sew Lingerie Elastic is the best brand to use for gathered, puffed sleeves. Use a wide zig-zag and long stitch length. The best size to use is onequarter inch wide. When using other brands be sure the elastic is soft and has a lot of elasticity.

Hopefully, these little hints will come in handy with your next sewing project. See you next issue.
