## INSURANCE NOTES

## INJURIES \& CLAIMS

Any injury that requires a doctor's attention, no matter how slight, should be reported to the Insurance Chairman whether a financial claim is needed or not. This establishes notification for whatever may develop.

## ACTIVITIES \& SPECIAL EVENTS

Whenever cooresponding with the District Insurance Chairman, one should always include any flyer that contains the club calendar. This will relay information to him that is oft times required.

## ARE YOU DANCING UNINSURED?

Is your square or round dance club operating without Liability and Medical Insurance coverage in 1991? If so, you are jeopardizing your club, your members and yourself as an officer.

For a mere $\$ 2.00$ per person you can be insured for a total of $\$ 1,000,000$ which guarantees legal coverage in case of suit for damages, plus medical coverage up to $\$ 10,000$ including dental. The only real stipulation is that all members of the club must sign up. If members belong to more than one club they need to sign up only once to meet this requirement.

Not only does our insurance program cover a member no matter where they dance - at their home club or any other recognized outside dance - but also at any scheduled dance in a foreign coun-
try.
Furthermore, when traveling together as a group on public transportation to a scheduled dance, for banner stealing or as a mystery trip, the group has full coverage.

With this sort of protection, club officers, members and guest dancers can dance assured that all will be well should the unexpected happen.

## CLUBS OF THE MONTH

## R \& R SQUARES

In 1963, Ray Neely became interested - in calling, after having taken square dance lessons at Mac's Barn in Kulpsville, PA.

Working with a small group of Knights of Columbus members, Ray \& Rosemary Neely formed the R \& R ('R'ay \& 'R'osemary) Square Dance Club in September of 1966.

Since the Knights of Columbus hall was not always available, Ray finished the basement of their home and continued teaching there for the next 14 years. He also introduced and taught round dancing to the group. At first, club dances were held at their home, but as the club grew they moved to the North Wales Elementary School.

In 1980, after a "Fun Night" at the Village of Neshaminy Falls, Montgomeryville, PA, Ray was invited to teach a class, and later to hold the R \& R club dances at the Club House there - which continued until he became ill in December of 1983.

Rosemary is still active with the club with her husband Ed Lagan, currently serving as treasurer. Other officers include: President, Rose \& Aaron Silverstein; and Vice President, Mary Lou \& Gus Riman.

An era ended on December 14, 1990 when Gene \& Laura Senatore retired as cuer after many great round dancing
years. Peg \& Joe Dockry became the club's cuer on January 11, 1991.

In 1989, the club moved to Montgomeryville Elementary School, Stump Road, Montgomeryville, PA, and dance on the 2nd and 4th Fridays from 7:30 to 10:30 p.m. (pre-rounds 7:30-8:00 p.m.).

Come join us, at the club wearing those black and white badges in the shape of a locomotive, and get in on "Track II". They've been "on the right track" for 24 years!

## EDGE HILL SQUARES

In the summer of 1957, caller Ray Shubert was invited to present a square dance demo at Julia \& Malcolm Shaffer's home in North Hills, PA. That fall, they asked their Civic Association to sponsor dances at the fire hall, which were so successful that these very eager dancers persuaded them to hold a dance each month.

These folks were very active in many local community activities, and were content to dance just once a month for several years - until two years prior to the 16th National Convention (held in Philadelphia in 1967) - they added a second Saturday each month to their schedule, in order to feel comfortable attending that convention. Charter members, Mary \& Bob Dennis, Thelma \& Bob Graham, Alice \& Tom Wilson, Dottie \& Roy Shubert and many other members, in fact, were involved in that convention, and gave many hours of their time to that memorable experience.

In 1972, Gene \& Laura Senatore were contracted as round dance leaders. When the hall was air conditioned, this was the only local club dancing in the summer, with guest callers. (No summer dancers are held now.)

Long-time friendships have formed among this thoughtful and caring group, and in this atmosphere, members volunteer to decorate the hall for each dance to match the theme for that evening, following the program made up for the year. (They are known for their decorated cakes and surprise dances.) Five charter members are still dancing. Weekend trips, parade dancing and floats, picnics, and demos at hospitals,

## RUTHIE'S SEWING BASKET

by Ruth McLay

If you would like to try cutting out a pattern without using pins, try the following suggestions.
Start by taking long deep bites with the shears. Then, slide them forward and take another deep bite with the shears. Be careful not to close the shear points. Your cutting will be smooth if you do not let the point of the shears of the table at any time. Work from the largest part of the pattern to the smallest when cutting on the grain (pattern will indicate). This is the easiest method. When using electric shears it is easier to cut with the grain. However, if the procedure is reversed the shears may refuse to cut.

There are four grain rules: 1) Cut with the grain; 2) Sew with the grain; 3) Press with the grain; and 4) Fit with the grain.

This is a guideline as all pattern and fabric work proceeds from the floor to the shoulders and from the center of the figure to the sides.

When stitching do not pivot at a corner, continue stitching to the edge of the fabric. Pivoting at a corner may cause a small pucker when the next layer of fabric is stitched to the garment.

## 40TH NATIONAL SEMINARS

The very heart and substance of any National Convention is the opportunity to learn more about your role as dancer, caller, cuer, promoter and leader. Seminars, panels and clinics offer this opportunity to listen and learn from some of the best and most experienced people in square dancing today.

Seminars are the educational backbone in square dancing. At the 40 th $\mathrm{Na}-$ tional, each international organization will offer education relevant to its charter and area of specialization. Those organizations are:

Legacy, the International Assembly of "Trustees" of the Square Dance Activity. Legacy is the "home office" of square dance composed of members (trustees) representing ail facets of the
square dance community. They are the ones who ask, "What can we do to help further, promote and perpetuate square dance?" Legacy will conduct three twohour seminars on topics from "Everything a Club Leader Needs to Know" to "How to Conduct Leadership Training Sessions". Don't miss it!

Callerlab, the International Association of Square Dance Callers. These seminars, two two-hour sessions per day, will be conducted by accredited caller coaches presenting topics necessary for caller improvement and contribution to the activity. Even if you are not a caller but would like a bit of insight into calling, attend these sessions - it may just be an eye opener!

Roundalab, the International Association of Round Dance Teachers. Three two-hour sessions presenting subjects ranging from cueing, styling, rhythms and teaching are done by folks known for their knowledge of the subject matter and ability to pass it on. It's another great opportunity to enhance your ability and expand your knowledge and concepts. Interested dancers and future cuers are invited to attend.

Contralab, the International Association of Contra Callers. Three two-hour seminars will be presented concerning the facets of contra calling and dancing, i.e. music, timing and use of contra in square and round dance clubs as a tool to teach timing. Callers, cuers and dancers can expand their capabilities and enjoy a "triple treat".

## EULOGY

It is with great sorrow that we note the passing of Jim McLay. Jim and his lovely wife Ruth began their dancing career as ballroom dancers. After becoming accomplished in that area they joined a square dance class. Jim graduated from the Buckaroo Square Dance Club in the early 1970's under the direction of Buck Fish. He went on to graduate round dance class under the instruction of Frank Fertsch. Jim's ballroom dancing carried over into square dancing earning him the nickname of "Mir. Smooth".

Jim and Ruth were instrumental in forming the Dixie Derby's Square Dance Club with their nephew, Glenn Matthew as the caller. In fact, it was Jim and Ruth who helped originate the pattern that made Dixie Derby's the great club it is today. ## SUPER SOUND IN SALT LAKE CITY

The 40th National Convention is committed to a great sound system. We realize dancers do not have fun if they cannot clearly hear and understand the music and calls.

We are actively seeking advice from sound experts who are knowledgeable with square dance sound systems. Our
plan at this time is to use Yak Stack speakers and Hilton turntables. Our Vice Chairmen of Sound, Craig \& Sandy Satterthwaite, are arranging to sell this equipment after the convention.

A sound trial square dance was held in the round dance halls. $23,400 \mathrm{sq}$. ft . of floor space was divided into three round dance halls. A 180 ft . long, 28 ft . high wall was created by suspending a double layer of carpet from rafters in the ceiling. As a result of our test we are planning some changes in how we install the carpet and are increasing the layers to four with three dead air spaces in between. We are confident this will assure the best sound possible when you dance in Salt Lake City in 1991.

## STANDARDIZATION OF CLASSIC DANCE CUES

In response to requests from dancers, Grenn Records and its own membership Roundalab, last June at its annual convention, created a new committee, "Standardization of Classic Dance Cues". Its purpose is to try and arrive at some standard cues for the classic round dances that traveling dancers will encounter no matter where they are dancing.

Over two dozen leaders volunteered to assist the committee which is chaired by Phil \& Royna Thomas (FL). Other round dance leaders from all over the world, as well as the original choreographer, were also contacted during the summer and fall and asked to submit their cueing words for dances on the Roundalab Golden Classic List.

All of their replies were then compared and compilations prepared using Roundalab approved standardized cues wherever possible. The revised cue sheets were then sent to the entire committee for another review. Once a cue sheet has been given final approval by the committee and choreographer, it will be published.
