

AMBASSADORS



CLUBS OF THE MONTH

DIXIE DERBYS

The summer of 1980 saw the birth of the Dixie Derbys, named after the then popular new call. Brought forth by a group of dancers who wanted to dance on the 1st, 3rd and 5th Fridays, they quickly found a dance hall at Upper Moreland Middle School, and a very new young caller, Glenn Matthew. The dance staff was enhanced by experienced cuer Gene Senatore and his wife Laura (who have recently retired), and the Dixies opened for business.

Their "baby" grew quickly, and by 1981 there were 94 club members and 43 class members. The first Memorial day Parade, club picnic and annual meeting was held in 1981. Since then the club's growth has been phenomenal, all due to the various talents of those who have become members, and have given freely of their time to support the many activities enjoyed by all. Present membership stands around 300.

The main purpose of the club is to promote the art and fun of square dancing, so Dixies have joined in many parades - Hatboro, Rockledge, Warminster, Southampton, Lansdale, Doylestown - in cold, heat and rain - even Mummers and Thanksgiving Day Parades in Philadelphia (placing 5th in the entire Mummers Parade). "We feel that we are reaching a great number of people by dancing in parades, showing how happy we are, being the colorful actors that we are," a charter member told us.

Dixies have given yearly exhibition demos for the continuance of square dancing through new students - being by their charter a teaching club; for this purpose they have danced at Super Sunday, Abington Hospital June Fete, Township Bi-Centennial and Parks and Recreation, various community groups, etc. - and even McDonald's!

The Dixies are really two clubs - they answered the need for a Mainstream level club for those who prefer that level, and especially for recent graduates who need to reinforce their just-learned skills.

Many callers and dancers have thanked the Dixies for providing a facility for those not at Plus level. In January, a used square dance clothing sale is held at a Mainstream dance to give students and others great bargains in our "costumes". Besides the two club dance levels, Dixies sponsor classes in square dancing (graduating their 10th consecutive class this spring) with Glenn Matthew teaching. Beginning round dance lessons, with Russ Booz teaching, are also sponsored by the Dixies.

Mountain weekends, mystery bus trips (including the National Convention in Baltimore and to the Canadian Convention), picnics, campouts, dinner dances (1 to 2 per year), special dances with National callers, and an annual New Year's Eve Dance/Party for 200 people - a VERY active club indeed!

The club is justly proud of caller Glenn Matthew, as they have watched his talents grow. He now calls in 17 states, logging 50,000 miles per year. He is also co-owner of Twirls & Swirls square dance and western wear shop, and owner and producer of Cobra Records. The first weekend of October finds him running a dance weekend at Seaside Heights, N.J. - an annual event.

Last year the Dixie Derbys celebrated their 10th anniversary with a dinner dance and lots of hoopla marking their "baby's" birthday. We salute this unique club on all their accomplishments and wish them decades more of fun and frolic!

RUTHIE'S SEWING BASKET

by Ruth McLay

Here are a few hints that may come in handy when sewing:

 Save all your leftover fabrics to make a patchwork skirt - definitely original!

 Make a belt purse to match your outfit. They're perfect for little things we

need to carry along with us.

 Instead of leaving those skirts that are too tight in the closet, try using wide elastic for your skirt, cutting it to your normal waist measurement (less two inches). Cover with matching fabric and stitch in place to your skirt. This will help overcome a slight weight gain or loss.

 Earrings to match your outfit may be made by covering buttons with the same fabric as your dress and then glued to earring backs - a perfect match!

 Nylon zippers can be repaired by holding your steam iron over the zipper while working the zipper up and down several times, then close it to let it cool.

 If your neckline is to deep on you, try adding lace to a square or V-neckline.
 On a round neckline, try running small gathers first inside the facing, adjusting gathers as needed.

When going to square dance conventions, be sure to visit the sewing clinics they provide. You'll be surprised with all the ideas you'll come away with.

GROUND RULES FOR BANNER STEALING

 A banner may be captured at any regularly scheduled club dance by a visiting club having two or more squares present.

2. All visitors must be registered in the guest book and must be wearing

their club badges.

 Couples who belong to more than one club cannot represent one club and steal a banner from another to which they belong.

4. A club may "steal" a banner or retreive a banner on a club visit but not both at once. It takes a visit to steal and

a visit to retreive.

- 5. When there is more than one visiting club having at least two squares present, the club that has at least two squares registered first in the host club's guest book is entitled to the banner. (This is to prevent discrimination against small clubs.)
- 6. In the event the host club's banner has already been captured and is thus not available, the host club shall give the visiting club a raincheck and as soon as convenient after it recaptures its own banner, must deliver it to the club holding the raincheck. If two squares accompany the banner, it may be taken home again from that same dance. Otherwise, it must be recaptured according to Rule #7.
- 7. A banner may be recaptured at any of the next three scheduled dances of the captor club by two squares or by one square if beyond the three scheduled dances time limit. After ten scheduled dances, the banner may be recaptured by any one or more couples visiting the captor club.
- 8. A banner may be captured only one time (by the same club) within a dancing year (September to September).
- A club is allowed to have a traveling banner which must be a reasonable facsimile of the master banner.
- 10. A club having a traveling banner will not display its master banner while the traveling one is in the possession of another club.
- 11. The capturing club agrees to exercise good care of the captive banner

and to have it available at the dance when the members of its club come to take it home.

12. Any club not wishing to participate in banner stealing should make this known to the District Secretary, and it will be duly noted in the Club News Section of the District Publication.

DEDICATED PHONE NUMBER 1-609-298-8828

"Dedicate" means to set apart for a special use. Therefore, our dedicated phone number is one that is set aside specifically for the use of square and round dancers. Persons entering the Delaware Valley area can now dial this number and receive information about clubs that may be dancing on a particular night. They can find out when, where, level and time a club in the Delaware Valley is dancing. When a new neighbor moves into the area they also can quickly locate a place to dance at their level close to their new residence. 
