## NOT TO EARLY TO THINK ABOUT INSURANCE

From past experience, we know no club in the Federation should be dancing in the new year ahead without Liability and Accident Medical Insurance coverage.

For the very nominal fee of $\$ 2.00$ per person (unchanged from this year) just the medical coverage is worth the price. In addition, to have your square dance club insured against any possible liability legal suit relieves the officers of a great responsibility; to have all members receive compensation for medical expenses they may incur through an injury on the dance floor, or in the parking area at the dance, provides a warm feeling of safety.

There are certain rules and procedures worth noting at this time (relatively no change from this year):

1) For a club and its officers to be insured, all members ( $100 \%$ ) must sign up. If belonging to more than one club, members need only pay the one fee, but must indicate having paid when approached by the second club.
2) Clubs with less than two squares (16 persons) as members, must pay the minimum fee of $\$ 30.00$, even though the

majority of members have paid their fee at other clubs. This gives the club liability protection.
3) Class members, sponsored by an insured club, are automatically covered and do not pay the fee.
4) All insurance matters should be handled through District Insurance Chairmen. Check your District officers as to who this representative may be in the coming year.
5) District and Federation officers are insured, provided they have paid their fees with an insured club.

Deadline for completion of insurance matters is November 30 -- this early date is necessary in order that clubs requiring Certificates of Additional Insured, requested by individual dance locations by early January 1992, can be satisfied.

Required forms and instructions are in the hands of District Insurance Representatives -- make your needs as well as your questions, known to him.

284 round dance teachers, representing 152 teaching units from 34 states in the United States, two Canadian provinces and New Zealand attended the 15th Annual Convention of Roundalab, the International Association of Round Dance Teachers, Inc., in Salt Lake City, Utah last June.

Eastern Region of the United Square Dancers of America.

It was a very busy three days as leaders from various backgrounds shared their expertise and knowledge in a free interchange of ideas. This will enable those who only "cue" rounds to join Roundalab and receive its printed materials, partake of its educational opportunities, be covered by insurance and secure their BMI/ASCAP licensing.

New figures, including some from the Mambo rhythm, were phased and descriptions written. A tentative Phase III Teaching Progression Guideline was adopted. The herculean task of standardizing the cues for the Roundalab Golden Classic Listing was accomplished. These cues were adopted as a tentative standard for a two year period.

Five tuition scholarships were awarded to members planning to attend round dance teacher's schools. At the Awards Banquet, Ann McCreary accepted the Distinguished Service Award for George \& Johnnie Eddins who were unable to attend the ceremonies. The Silver Circle Award was presented to Charlie \& Edith Capon and Harmon \& Betty Jorritsma. The Silver Halo was awarded to Wayne \& Norma Wylie, Roundalab's first chairman.

While at the convention, all teachers had the opportunity to attend teacher training seminars and workshops, figure execution sessions in various rhythms and phases and a clinic on Argentine Tango. The Wednesday Teacher's Seminar concentrated on figures in the Foxtrot and Mambo rhythms.

Roundalab also conducted its usual daily two-hour seminars at the National Square Dance Convention. These sessions were also very well attended. About 92\% of the Roundalab teaching units remained in Salt Lake City to share their talents at the 40th National Square Dance Convention.

Elected to the Board of Directors were Barbara \& Jim Connelly (VT), Betty \& Irv Easterday (MD), Sharon \& Casey Parker (CA) and Larry \& Pam Wacker (KS). Continuing on the Board are Ray \& Anne

## STARTING ROUND DANCING

by Joe \& Peg Dockry

In the fail, we usually see the start of basic round dance classes. The student's choice of a group can depend on the class being held on a "free" night, a convenient location, or the teacher's being the cuer for the student's square dance club. Most of our round dance students come from square dance clubs, and although this square dance experience is not necessary to round dancing, it would appear to be of some intangible assistance (1) in relating to the musical beat and (2) in having square dancing friends in the round dance class, rather than entering a group "cold".

What can the beginner do to make his round dance course easier? Firstly, one should avoid taking two types of lessons at once. During our square dance lessons 20 years ago, we saw round dancing for the first time and, wanting to take that too, were cautioned not to do so. Now that I teach, I can appreciate the wisdom of concentrating on one course at a time. Taking two courses at once can be done, be the subtle difficulties presented and the various weaknesses ensuing may not always be apparent to the dancer. The person who graduates from mainstream square dancing, dances through the summertime, and gets a solid grounding in plus dancing is ready for round dancing.

Secondly, the round dance student should make all reasonable efforts to avoid missing lessons. To miss an early lesson or a series of lessons can be devastating to the beginner. This consideration ties in with my third point -that of cassette or video recording lessons as an assist to learning. If you must miss a round dance lesson, perhaps a friend can record the class material for you. During the course of our lessons, frequently we did not have a chance to practice, but our playing the cassette at suppertime before our class was a helpful reminder.

Lastly, how far do we go with round dancing? To start as a student does not mean that our eventual goal is the Phase

VI level. There is an unfortunate human tendency (and not only in dance circles) to identify the highest with the best, or most desirable. The helpful innovation of classifying dance levels should not carry over into classifying dancers as "most" or "least" accomplished. How often has the reminder from our cuer (or caller) of "Smile -- this is your recreation!" brought us down to earth? Round dancing or square dancing, we should enter the activity with the goal in mind that we are going to dance the level at which we are comfortable. Such a goal is not a settling for second best; it should be a happy achievement. A teacher could ask for no more for his or her students.

## 1991 ORGANIZATION DINNER

During the National Convention in Salt Lake City, Utah, chairmen and representatives of national square dance organizations met for an informal planning session. Attending were Dave Fisher and Mary Adams, Single Square Dancers U.S.A.; Earl \& Joy Hoyt, United Square Dancers of America; Art Harvey, Contralab; Ralph \& Joan Collipi, Roundalab Chairmen; Doc \& Peg Tirrell, Roundalab Executive Secretaries; Mae \& Len Sprosty, National Square Dance Campers Association; and Stan \& Cathie Burdick, Legacy.

These meetings were instituted by Legacy to seek ways in which national organizations may complement each other and work cooperatively. Next year the meeting will be expanded in time and called a "Summit" meeting. A project to pursue for the betterment of square dancing and its annual national showcase was suggested unanimously by those attending this year.

Each organizational representative reported on major new projects and goals. Single Square Dancers U.S.A.'s goal is increased recruitment and promotion of singles, with recognition of singles' programs. They are involved in BMI/ASCAP discussions.

Roundalab offers an educational program to leaders and dancers, and now
has a membership classification for cuers as well as teachers. They promote rounds and squares together and are working on publicity and the BMI/ASCAP situation.

United Square Dancers of America has a plan to secure BMI/ASCAP licensing for those not covered elsewhere. They are developing a strong program aimed at youth and are working to gain recognition at national conventions.

National Square Dance Campers Association's goal is to recruit more camper/dancers. Three new chapters were formed in each of the last two years. The organization now stands at 166 chapters, with 15 couples needed to start a chapter. They feel camping and square dancing go hand in hand. They have an attractive magazine and place ads in other publications.

Contralab is designing a new badge incorporating the square, circle and line emblem, working toward a "better marriage" of square, round and contra dancing. A booklet on "What is Contra?" is being developed.

Callerlab, as reported by Stan Burdick, who is a member of the board of governors, has two additions to its continuing education program: a textbook for caller training and a CAC report which illustrates standard ways to teach all the Mainstream figures. To promote square dancing, a new promotional folder with a modern look is being developed.

Legacy's 1991 resolutions and recommendations were reviewed. Suggestions for "Summit" topics may be sent to Pres \& Kay Minnick, chairmen, 6882 Garland St., Arvada, CO 80004.

## RUTHIE'S SEWING BASKET

With the holiday season upon us, perhaps you would like to orient your square dance attire accordingly.

How about a basic skirt made of red, green or white (or any color of your choice) made from "felt", This would eliminate hemming and some sewing.

Cut out a circular skirt requiring only one seam down the back, plus zipper and skirt band. Cut the skirt to your desired length.

Decorate the skirt by gluing appliques (bells, snowflakes, Christmas trees, etc.) cut out of different colors of felt. For an added little touch, glue sequins, beads or glitter scribbles to the appliques before applying them to the skirt. Make sure they are well dried first. (All of the above items can be purchased at craft shops or fabric stores.)

This type of skirt is not washable. But I do believe there is a "washable felt"
available. I, personally, have never used it, therefore, I cannot recommend it at this point for washing.

A telt bolero could be added to this idea using the same procedure as used for the skirt. But make sure to cut the armholes deep enough to avoid the bleeding of the felt onto your blouse when perspiring.

If you desire a white outtit, wear a coordinating color blouse (red or green) to set off your outfit.

The above ideas can also be used with regular blended fabric, it just involves a little more sewing.

You can also sew a complete dress and decorate just the skirt. Do your own thing - be creative. Also, you can coordinate your partners outfit with yours by making him a bolero, etc.

## 3,000 LEADERS ATTEND SALT LAKE CITY ASCAP/BMI SEMINAR

3,000 square and round dance callers, cuers, dancers and leaders attended the two-hour ASCAP/BMI Seminar in Salt Lake City sponsored by the National Square Dance Convention Executive Committee with its President, Ernie Stone as moderator.

Three National ASCAP and one BMI officials represented the two organizations in the special meeting held on Thursday evening of the 40th National Convention in the outstanding Symphony Hall.

General consensus of the meeting was that clubs, callers, cuers and organizations need to be licensed, but not both as a caller or cuer and a club or organization. The attending officials indicated they did not plan to penalize anyone until plans could be worked out satisfactorily to all concerned.

At the present time, Callerlab has an approved plan to license callers and cuers, and the United Square Dancers of America is seeking authority to license clubs and organizations.

tional Square Dance Convention endorses and supports the efforts of the United Square Dancers of America in its negotiations with ASCAP/BMI in obtaining a licensing agreement for clubs not utilizing licensed callers and cuers.

In another major decision the Executive Committee ruled that all future conventions will be four-day events starting on the Wednesday preceding the fourth Thursday. This was done since already thousands of dancers are in convention cities for pre-convention dances and sightseeing, and this will encourage hotels to reserve rooms for four nights instead of three. Future date will be: Cincinnati - June 24-27, 1992; St. Louis June 23-26, 1993; Portland - June 22-25, 1994; and Birmingham - June 21-24, 1995.
