PA. STATE FEDERATION NEWS UPDATE


At the semi-annual meeting of the Pennsylvania State Federation, it was voted to hold a state convention providing all six member organizations agree. Further news about this event will probably be available after the meeting scheduled for September.

In other news... The membership structure has been changed in our Con-

stitution. In the past, you'r membership was from June 1st to May 31st. This has been changed to the calendar year. There will be no dues collected for the second half of 1992, instead dues will be due January 1, 1993. Dues which have already been received for 1992-93 will be entered as 1993 dues. Stickers for 1993 will be delivered upon receipt of same. We have also set dues so you can pay for any number of years - up to ten.

Please join through your club or district as soon as possible. If joining as an individial, please enclose a self-addressed stamped envelope for your dangle (if joining for the first time) or your sticker.

There are currently 703 state square dance license plates on the road. Remember, the state mandates that you must continue to maintain your membership in the Pennsylvania State Federation to keep your license plate. If you are interested in applying for these plates, there is an application blank in the current issue of the "Pennsy News", and they are also available through local clubs.

RUTHIE'S SEWING BASKET

Here's a good idea which may save you a lot of shopping around for a dress for that special holiday or dance.

Try making an overlay or short apron that will change the appearance of your outfit.

These aprons can be made fancy with ruffles or just plain, square or round. You may use or a sheer material or whatever strikes your fancy. Use a nice contrasting color or the same color as your dress, using some kind of trim to make it stand out in appearance. If your dress is solid use a print for the apron.

To trim your apron use a contrasting color of Ric Rac or lace. If you are so inclined, use the latest rage - painting on flowers, teddy bears, or whatever you choose. You could fasten the apron with ties or maybe velcro or hooks.

In fact, you can give your dress a different look by omitting the ties and making two aprons and fastening them together with velcro at the side of the waist.

Also, try making three or more tieless aprons and fasten them together as above and adjust them around your waist - off center. This will resemble a bussle-type appearance for your dress.

If you need more room around your waist, add another apron. If your waist is smaller, gather the apron more or omit one apron. Be original. I know you will come up with something unique.



AFTER ROUND DANCE GRADUATION - WHAT NEXT?

With our crisp round dance basics diploma clutched in our hot little hands, we seldom question, "Where do we go from here?". We are well aware of the steps that lie beyond and so we follow the crowd up the ladder, never asking, "Why?".

The average basic course never equips the dancer to step into a highly experienced intermediate club. It took more years than I would like to say for this fact to penetrate my consciousness. Now we provide a further "intermediate workshop" to channel the new graduate into our intermediate group, rather like a Plus workshop that follows square dance graduation. Not once have I heard a basics graduate say, "I'm not interested in intermediate dancing."

What teacher would not want to see in his/her students an avid interest in advancement? I know that I am pleased when new dancers desire to continue their learning. However, before advancing, we need to take an honest look at

the course we have just firmished. Did we enjoy it? Did the "heated discussion" level rise? Are we simply following our friends? Do we really want to devote additional time, energy and concentration? Actually, is it not heresy to say, "We are happiest dancing easy rounds."

If round dancing is no longer fun, if there is no sense of achievement, if we no longer agree, it's time to find our happy place in dancing. There are many ways to put together the square and round dance package. The best combinations for you are the levels that provide the most enjoyment of your recreation, those two final words indicating quite plainly "of or relating to you or yourself or yourselves" and "a means of refreshment or diversion". Does that describe your round dancing? I hope so.




