Perhaps the following hints will help your sewing to be more enjoyable if everything is close at hand and ready to use.

First of all, be sure your sewing machine is in tip top condition.

Secondly, gather together all the items needed, including your pattern. Be sure to fit your pattern to your measurements ahead of time, including the length.

Choose a good material. Some sewers wash their materials first. Have good, sharp scissors, pins, thread and various other items, such as a measuring tape, buttons, snaps, etc.

It will be most helpful to have your ironing board and iron close at hand. Quite frequently seams and darts need to be pressed before going on to the next step. A one-inch thick pad on your ironing board will prevent ridging of darts and seams. Also, press the dart in the correct direction.

When sewing slippery material, pin a towel over the end of your machine to keep the material from sliding.

As of this date we expect 1993 insurance fees may increase $5^{c}$ for a total of $\$ 2.20$ per person, a most reasonable cost considering the value.

Remaining unchanged for next year are: (1) Clubs must have all members signed up for insurance; (2) Clubs with less than 16 members will have a fixed fee of $\$ 32.00$; and ( 3 ) Class members are insured, but are not charged the fee.

If you anticipate being required to show a Certificate of Additional Inaured for your dance location early in January of 1993, be certain that fees are collected and submitted prior to November 10, 1992.

## LEGACY INTERNATIONAL CONDUCTS A SURVEY

by Walt \& Louise Cole

Legacy International, is conducting its 5th biennial survey during the 1991-92 square dance year. This survey, "New Dancer Longevity" is geared to trying to get a handle on the drop-out situation. Some of the housekeeping procedures followed the sampling methods used in the 1990 Legacy Census of the square dance population. A 10\% sample was taken from the club contacts listed in the National Square Dance Directory. This meant mailing to 612 U.S. and 74 Canadian contacts; a total of 686 . Each contact was asked to submit the names and addresses of those "drop-outs" in December, January and April; 24\% of the contacts responded. In turn, each of the
drop-outs were then sent a questionnaire as to: (1) Why did you enroll in a square dance class? (2) Why did not you continue in this class? and (3) Comments. These responses were compiled, categorized as to reasons and analyzed by the survey committee, Legacy, and results were made available by the Na tional Square Dance Convention during Legacy Seminars.

Some interesting data from club contacts are: $16 \%$ of the clubs had no dropouts in December; 30\% of the clubs did not offer a class; and 8\% of the clubs had folded. (This is a total of $38 \%$ of potential growth.) The average class size reported was 21 students. The average number of drop-outs per class was six or a $28 \%$ drop-out rate in December; January and April rates, are, at present, substantially less. Six clubs had no dropouts during the entire year!

One very illuminating appearance of the drop-out response is that most are very positive and intend to rejoin a class next year.
