# DVS\&RD FEDERATION DANCERS PERFORM AT EXPO '92 IN SEVILLE, SPAIN

On June 4, 1992, 18 square dancers from the Delaware Valley, with their caller, Tom Kovacevich and his bride of two weeks, Emily, who was also one of our dancers, boarded a plane at the Philadelphia Airport -- destination Expo '92 in Seville, Spain. We were all excited and got little sleep during our flight to Seville, via JFK New York, Madrid and into Seville, with a few anxious moments in Madrid when we found that the computer there had dropped four of our couples from the flight to Seville, but with much discussion and persistance, two were put on an earlier flight, and the others were found seats on our scheduled flight. A shakey beginning, but we all rejoiced to be reunited in Seville Aiport, and to meet our contact, Mr. Jay Donnelly, and be escorted to our bus that would take us to Moron Air Base (managed and arranged for us by United States personnel).

Our rooms were a surprise, four bunk beds to a room, one room per couple, air conditioned with ceiling fans. We also had a small refrigerator in each room, but the bathroom facilities were down the hall. We had breakfast every morn-
ing at the dining hall, included with our room -- a very welcome meal that we appreciated more and more as the days went by. After a short tour of the Base, a snack at the Rec Lounge, and a quick run through for our next day's performance, we climbed into our bunks, exhausted.

At 9:00 a.m. our bus was waiting outside our door to take us to the Fair. We were all loaded down with square dance outtits, our banner, Tom's equipment, etc, for our six scheduled performances -- two shows a day for the next three days. We were pleasantly surprised to find that our "passes" to the Fair were good tor 10 days instead of the three original days. What a bonus! Now we could take our time enjoying and exploring the other countries pavillions.

We stored all of our clothes, etc. in lockers provided by the U.S. Pavillion, checked out some of the interesting exhibits and pavillions, had lunch (box lunches from Moron), and returned to the U.S. Pavillion for our first performance. Tom, our caller, had put together our opening and closing routines, and our six performances were very well received by all the spectators. We all did our share of having fun and promoting square dancing for our country -- closing each dance session with "God Bless the U.S.A." At our first performance we even discovered a couple of square dancers in our audience and persuaded them to come up on stage and dance with us. The crowd loved it and we made two new square dancing friends.

Later that evening, to top off our three days of performance, we all met for an evening together to watch the local Flamingo Dancers, and ended up watching the spectacular fireworks display.

We were up again early the next morning, and each morning thereafter, to board our bus for sightseeing in the surrounding area. On our first free day we toured the great Cathedral, the Tower of Gold, and the narrow streets and shops of the Old Jewish Quarter, The Barrio, in Seville, ending up across the river at the Fair, and more visits to the many pavillions (103 countries).

On day seven, we travelled by air conditioned bus to the town of Granada (ap-
proximately three hours) to tour the Moorish Fortress/Palace, The Alhambra, even squaring up and dancing, to show our guide, Pepe, what we did in square dancing! Tom did a great job calling. even without music, and Pepe was impressed.

On day eight, we travelled to Cordobo to see the world's oldest Mosque (circa 1200). We also enjoyed great shopping, carriage rides and many interesting sights.

## DANCE, BUT BE INSURED

Square dance insurance time, like income tax, comes around each year. However, unlike paying taxes, insurance does not hurt, but provides a safety factor as well as peace of mind.

The Delaware Valley Federation Insurance Program will be available for 1993. As hard as we try to be safe, accidents do happen on the dance floor. The medical portion of our insurance helps to protect club members from large financial loss due to a bodily injury while attending a square or round dance. The liability portion of the policy protects the club, its members and the officers from financial loss due to unforseen accidents or damage to property that may develop into court actions.

District Insurance Representatives should now have in hand procedure instructions and a supply of the required forms used to sign up for the program. The fee is $\$ 2.20$ per person, for 1993 represents only a $\$ .05$ increase over the
past year.
Basic rules have relatively little changt from prior years:

1. For a club and its officers to be insured, all members ( $100 \%$ ) must sigr up. If belonging to more than one club members need pay only the one fee, bu must indicate having paid when ap proached by the second club.
2. Clubs with less than two squares ( $1 €$ people) as members must pay the mini. mum fee of $\$ 32.00$ even though the ma. jority of members have paid their fee al other clubs. This gives the club liability protection.
3. Class members sponsored by an insured club are automatically covered and DO NOT PAY A FEE.
4. All insurance matters should be handled through the District Insurance Chairman. Check with your District Officers to see who this representative may be in the coming year.
5. District and Federation Officers are insured, provided they have paid their fees with an insured club.


The deadline for completion of insurance sign-ups is November 30, 1992. This early date is necessary to ensure that clubs requiring Certificates of Additional Insurance, required be individual dance locations by early January, 1993 can be notified.

## RUTHIE'S SEWING BASKET

We trust everyone is on their way to another year of good and happy dancing and looking forward to a great holiday season.

## DO YOU KNOW?

Use a glue stick to place trim before sewing. (Glue may be kept in the refrigerator when not in use.)

Also, use the gentle cycle when washing petticoats in your washing machine. Arrange the petticoat evenly so the agitator is at the waist opening. Try drying petticoats by laying them on an open patio umbrella.

To preshrink materials, such as cotton, lace, braids or rick rack, try submerging them in very warm water. Then loop them over the shower rod to drip dry. It is not advisable to wash them in the washing machine or dry them in the dryer. Material will trist and cause wrinkles, etc.

For a neat finished look, line your bodice. This will eliminate adding facings in most garments.

Waistlines may be piped to help hold their shape. You can purchase piping or make your own. Always use matching fabric.

Keep a check on your petticoat elastic.

Open casing, remove old and elastic and replace with new.

The above are just a few reflections on "Do you know?". You will find more in later additions from time to time. I hope you will enjoy them and put them to good use.

Future General Chairmen include: 1993 - Robert \& Karen Flehr; 1994 - Don \& Shirley White; 1995 - John \& Dimple Williford; and 1996 - Jay \& Merle Gearman.
A.R. Rodgers was elected to serve as President of the National Executive Committee from July 1 through June 30, 1993. Other officers include: Vice President, Chet \& Billie Ferguson; Secretaries, Glenn \& Lois Baldwin; and Treasurers, Carl \& Jean McCarver. Howard \& Peggy Thornton will continue as Directors of Information.

The 20,703 at Cincinnati, OH, included 5,017 from OH; 1,613 from MI; 1,282 from IN; and 1,225 from PA.
