A new state outfit will be considered from models presented at the next meeting in May. However, the present outfit will be in effect through 1994. After that, a minimum of five years will be established before another outfit can be considered.

A trip to Alaska on June 10, 1993 aboard the Holland American ship "Nordam" is planned. Tom Miller will be the caller. Flyers are available now.

A new motion was passed to sponsor an annual State Convention. Candidates for General Chairmen of the Convention should submit their resumes to PSRDF Presidents, Bill \& Joan Flick, by January 1, 1993 for review by the Convention Advisory Board.
