# PENNSYLVANIA STATE MEMBERSHIP 

by Clarence \& Juanita Dye

The membership structure has been changed in our constitution. In the past, your membership was from June 1 to May 31. This has been changed to the calendar year. There were no dues collected for the second half of 1992, instead the were collected in January, 1993.

Remember... if you have the square dance license plates, the state mandates that you must continue to maintain membership in the organization to keep your plates.

The Board approved a Lifetime Membership at $\$ 20.00$ per person, $\$ 40.00$ per couple. You can also pay in advance for up to ten years. This can be paid through your club along with the regular dues. Even if you get to the point where you are no longer dancing, you will want to keep your tags, and by paying the lifetime membership you will not have to worry about it.

It would be a big help if everyone signed up through your local club or Fed-
eration. Talk to the officers of your club and see if they will support a membership drive. It's very easy, just collect $\$ 1.00$ per year, per member or $\$ 20.00$ per member for lifetime membership. Fill out the Application Renewal form and attach a copy of your club roster designating which members have paid their dues, how many years they are paying for or if it is a lifetime membership, and if they are a caller or a cuer. (We are attempting to create a list of all callers and cuers who are members.) And send the information to either your local Federation or to us at the State Federation, along with a check made out to the PA State Federation. Please check the number of members you are paying dues for and compare the total to the amount of the check. You only need to join through one club, but if you would like a dangle for each club badge you could join through each club or order additional dangles at a cost of .50 cents per dangle.

Those who are joining for the first time will get a dangle. Those who have already received a dangle will get a sticker for the last year they are paying dues for. (Example: If you pay $\$ 10.00$ dues per couple your stickers will be for 1997.) If you are joining individually, instead of through your club, be sure you include a self-addressed stamped envelope with your dues.

Let's all get behind the State Federation and push for the largest membership possible. Wouldn't it be great to find out how many square dancers we have in the state of Pennsylvania?

Save yourself time and money by using the same dress pattern for making a skirt. Just eliminate using the bodice part of the pattern. Follow all instructions for making the skirt part, but add a waistband to your measurements allowing for overlapping, plus hook and eye.

Perhaps you are in to clogging. The small size skirt is usually 15 inches in length. Use the same pattern as mentioned above.

Now is the time to get your plans together for vacation time, which is not too far away. Have you given any thought as to how you will carry your square dance attire?

Patterns are available for most every type of carrier. Usually your fellow dancers have easy and very good ideas for tote bags (for shoes), petticoat bags and also carriers for food.

You may also want to crochet or knit a shawl for chilly evenings. This is a change from sweaters.

When traveling try to pack apparel that will not crush easily to avoid wrinkles. This will make you feel well-groomed at all times.
