The Federation currently has a membership of 2,600 . More square dancers will join as the classes graduate.

This means that Federation club members were deprived of the opportunity of supporting at least two "special" dances. The Officer's Ball was held as scheduled on February 21, at Rowan College, Glassboro, NJ. Although the weather was against us, over 25 squares danced to great calling by Ron Weiss. Rich Lock cued to a hall-filling group of round dancers.

The 1993 Convention is progressing very well. To date, 424 dancers have registered. On June 5, the committee will
attend the Quakertown Air Festival to put on a demonstration.

The New Jersey square dance plates were issued early in February, so it's possible that you might see them whenever you travel there.

At the National Convention in Portland, OR in June 1994, the Federation is going to make a bid to bring the convention to Philadelphia in 1999. The last convention held in this area was in 1977. It's a lot of work and will require the support of many dancers.

At the January committee meeting, the couples who participated in the exhibition presented Dick \& Betty Terrell with blue ribbons for "Best Supporting Couple" and Ron Weiss was later presented a blue ribbon for "Best Coach of the Year".

All persons who wish to be considered for the position of General Chairmen of the 1999 National Convention are requested to submit their resume immediately after receiving the following:

## CANDIDATE REQUIREMENTS

Important: All candidates for General Chairmen must be aware that it is a commitment of approximately seven years. Thereafter, they become National Executive Committee (NEC) members and are expected to serve for as long as they are willing and able to do so.

Candidates may not be square dance callers, round dance cuers, etc.

Answer: What is your square dance leadership background? Your health? Your age? Your family responsibilities? How many past National Conventions have you attended?

The husband and wife must be equally qualified to share the responsibility.

Business (employment) flexibility is necessary, as you must attend numerous meetings and travel, especially in the final year.

Candidates should be financially capable of assuming incidential expenses related to the position.

Candidates must assist in preparing a printed bid book which is mailed to each NEC member 90 days prior to the formal bid presentation at the National Convention.

Candidates must participate in a public bid session at the annual National Convention, and meet with the NEC privately later the same day.

Following the Convention Bid Award, candidates must attend each pre-convention and convention prior to their convention; and they must adhere to NEC Policies and Standard Operating Procedures during their five year planning period.

General Chairmen become NEC members at the pre-convention meeting prior to their own convention. Expenses to this meeting (travel, lodging, food allowance) and all future pre-convention meetings will be paid be the NEC. General Chairmen are required to attend all future pre-convention meetings and conventions thereafter in order to maintain their NEC membership.

Hundreds of volunteers will be needed to provide the efforts to support the Study Committee and then during the interim period before 1999. All club members are asked to consider their situations and be prepared to volunteer when asked. There will be many tasks that will be enriched by your individual talents.

In the event a decision to bid is reached, the presentation (and bid) will be made at the National Convention to be held during June 1994 in Portland, OR. As is expected for such presentations, a large showing of support is necessary to show that the entire Federation is behind the endeavor. A goal of 400 people willing to attend the bid session has been established. Those attending will wear an outfit designed by the Federation for that ocassion.


## PATIENCE REQUIRED

It is important to remember that all square dancers working on national conventions do this as volunteers. The Registration and Housing Committee work at the 42 nd National office every Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 11:00 a.m. to $4: 00$ p.m. You may call them at 314-849-2150 during this time if you have an inquiry. When the forms come in the mail, they are checked and then entered into the computer. Unfortunately, many dancers do not complete the form properly. Many important spaces are left incomplete, or the writing is illegible. Please print clearly.

The Committee is working very hard to get all confirmations in the mail, but housing must be thoroughly checked in order not to overbook any hotel. Please bear with us and we will get more confirmations out shortly.
