


SQUARE DANCER'S PRAYER



DANCING BY THE SEA WITH THE 3M'S





JOAN MAYERS FIRST VICE CHAIRPERSON



DIXIE DERBYS

Through the Star Rounders and Rainbow Rounds, a number of cuers, experienced and beginners, were brought onto the scene. But the real success of the

Rainbow Rounds materialized when Dolores and her caller/partner, Sam, officially became the round dance leaders in 1983.

Today at the Stroller's dances, the club will have as many as 20 couples or more on the floor at one time. Country western couples dancing has become part of the teaching of the Procopios, but only at the Stroller's club dances. The primary reason is to allow both square and round dancers to enjoy the newest craze.

Round dance classes are held each Tuesday at the Zion Spies Church, Alsace Twp., while round dance workshops are presented each. Wednesday at Reading-Muhlenberg Vo-Tech, Muhlenberg Twp. Membership has not only come from the Reading area but from dancers in the counties of Schuylkill, Montgomery, Lebanon and Lancaster, as well as Berks.

Registration for the 43rd National are off to a great start, thanks to the purchase of over 5,000 early bird "Oregon Seedlings" before February 1, 1993.

As expected, Oregon dancers purchased the most Seedling certificates: 2,585 (or approximately 50% of them). It was a pleasant surprise that so many dancers from other states purchased Seedlings! Our neighboring states, Washington and California, were our biggest supporters, with dancers from Washington purchasing 523 and Californians purchasing 515. Three other states topped the "century" mark, with over 100 Seedlings sold in each state: Illinois (166), Missouri (127) and Ohio (103). The two foreign countries with the highest number of registrations were Australia with 74, and Canada with 25.

In case you haven't noticed, this group is a bit guy shy. In other words, send some men angels.



GRATUITIES

There is no hard and fast rule on tipping, but experts who write etiquette books agree on two points: The amount of a tip is in direct proportion to the quality of service and your own generousity.

Using the preceding scenario as an example, here are some suggestions: The parking attendant should get 50 cents to \$1.00, as should the cloak-room attendant -- for each garment.

If the maitre d' was instrumental in getting you that intimate table, then he or she should be tipped -- the amount is up to you.

Was the wine steward helpful in describing and recommending the selection? Then he or she should be tipped 15%. The normal tip for one drink would be 10% -- 15% if you have more than one drink. If you request a particular number from the piano player, the usual gratuity is \$1.00 per song.

As a general rule, the waiter or waitress should be tipped 20% for outstanding service, 15% for good service and 10% for poor service. The tip should be figured by using the cost of the meal before taxes.

When you travel, here is what experienced travelers pay: cab drivers - 15%, unless that fare is less than \$5.00, then it's 20%; limousine drivers - 50 cents to \$1.00 as part of a group tip; tour bus guide - \$1.00 for an all-day outing, less for a half-day or shorter; redcaps and skycaps - \$1.00 per bag,

Sugguested tips for other services: hairstyling - 15% to 20%; hairwashing - \$1.00; and delivery of food, flowers, dry cleaning, prescriptions, etc. - \$1.00, more if the weather is bad.

If you're one of those lucky persons taking a cruise, you can follow these guidelines: cabin steward - minimum of \$2.00 per day; dining room steward - minimum of \$2.00 per day; busboy - \$1.00 per day; and wine steward - 15%.

If you decide to play golf while you are on vacation, the normal tip for the caddy is 15% to 20% of the green fee.



CATCH THE PIONE ER SPIRIT ON THE OREGON TRAIL!

1993 marks the 150th anniversary of the Oregon Trail, the route followed by the westward pioneers who traveled from Independence, MO to Oregon City, OR. We hope that those dancers from the northwestern part of the United States, who traveled by RV to St. Louis this June, followed the route of the Oregon Trail on their way home. The actual route is closely followed by old Highway 30, close to the modern routes of U.S. 80 and U.S. 84.

Today, we can travel the Oregon Trail in a few days time, counting stops for sightseeing and relaxation. The travelers who came west from 1843 until the 1870's took approximately six months to travel over 2,000 miles, at the pace of 12 to 15 miles a day. Imagine keeping house out of a wagon box that measured about three-by-ten feet!

If you are planning to attend the 43rd National in Portland, and will be traveling



by car or RV, you may want to consider retracing the Oregon Trail route! For more information, contact your public library. Many of the books written about the Oregon Trail include information about how to follow it on modern highways.


