## OREGON FIRST WITH STATE DANCE

Oregon was the first state to introduce legislation to recycle cans and bottles; Oregon was also the first state to recognize square dancing as the official state dance, in 1977. Discussion within the Oregon State Federation led to the introduction of a bill, accompanied by a custom singing call and a demonstration
dance in the State Capitol in Salem. Copies of the Oregon Federation News were sent to all legislators to show that the interest and participation in square dancing was statewide.

When the bill was side-tracked in a committee, dancing constituents of those committee members called to ask for a hearing. This pressure resulted in a hearing which included testimony from a young man from the Fairview Training Center. (This state center for mentally retarded adults benefits from a fundraiser sponsored each ye ar by the Oregon Federation. Square dancers have helped to purchase vans, a chapel and other projects.) This hearing was a success, and the bill was voted into law. Seventeen states now recognize square dancing as their state dance. Colorado is the newest, signed into law this year.

## FEDERATION NEWS FROM THE PRESIDENT

We plan to continue short articles from the Federation in all district publications and dance magazines, with the aim of keeping our dancers updated on happenings within the Delaware Valley.
What's happening with the bid for the 1999 National Convention? We are still negotiating with the Pennsylvania Convention and Conference Center in Philadelphia. Our General Chairmen elects, Clarence \& Juanita Dye, are ready to move forward with the bid to be presented in Oregon in June 1994, after all preliminaries have been agreed upon between our Federation and the Pennsylvania Convention Center.
Meetings with District Chairmen: All District Chairmen will be working with the Federation calendar in an effort to eliminate dances on same day, etc. We ask that all clubs cooperate in this effort,
knowing that it will take awhile until we see results from this action, but all clubs will benefit from the results.

There's no doubt that the current economic times have certainly affected our attendance for special events, however, our neighboring festivals, such as WASCA and Star Spangled Festival, don't seem to be experiencing the down slide in attendance as much as the Delaware Valley.

For the past several years, our local Delaware Valley committee's have visited clubs and special dances within our Federation to promote the convention. The 32nd Committee recently visited 38 regular club dances, 23 special dances sponsored by clubs or districts, and numerous weekend festivals.
We encourage you to glance through the beautiful program book from the


32nd Convention to see if your club submitted a booster list and/or ad. The Federation has approximately 88 clubs in our organization, and the Convention program book shows approximately 38 clubs submitted booster lists and 28 clubs submitted ads. Doug \& Jeanne Vollmer have been appointed as the chairmen of this committee, and welcome any comments and/or suggestions you have to benefit our future conventions. It's important that we know how to plan for the future; we need to know what the dancers expect from our convention. Take the first step and give the Vollmer's a call at (609) 456-1955.

Going Forward: It's impossible for any of us to attend every dance we'd like to. None of us have that much energy or available time. Let's remember, loyalty belongs to your home base, the Federation of the Delaware Valley. Continue to join hands in a square to support our home clubs and the Federation. Attend your club dances and meetings, district meetings, and we hope to see you at the next Federation Meeting on January 13, 8:00 p.m., at the Cherry Hill Hyatt Hotel in Cherry Hill, NJ.
