## 43RD NATIONAL TOURS

If you are planning to attend the 43rd National Convention in Portland, OR, June 22-25, you might consider taking some time out to catch one of the following tours:

Portland City Tour - Wednesday through Saturday (9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon; and 1:00 to 4:00 p.m.). It's just a short drive into the forested West Hills and the sprawling Washington Park. Here we will visit the world-renowned International Rose Test Gardens that overlook downtown Portland. You will have time to stroll through the gardens with the fragrance of the rose blossoms to accompany you. Our tour then winds through the Arlington Heights neighborhood where you can view the many
lovely home on your way to the Pittock Mansion. While touring the 1914 National Registry property, you will learn how Henry \& Georgiana Pittock contributed to the growth of Portland. The view of the city from the gardens surrounding the estate is truly outstanding. On your way back to the Convention Center, the business district, Waterfront Park, and other sites of interest will be visited. Time: 3 hours.

Multnomah Falls Tour - Wednesday through Saturday (9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.). You will leave Portland on 1-84 going east along the Columbia River to Multnomah Falls. The beauty of these falls, as they cascade 620-feet to the river below, and the elegant lodge makes it one of the most photographed falls in the United States. On the return trip to the city, you will follow the historic Columbia River Scenic Highway through mossyrocked forests. Additional waterfalls dot the landscape. After reaching Portland, we will climb through the West Hills section to the historic Pittock Mansion where you will have time to stroll the gardens and take in the spectacular view of the city. We will stop at the World Forestry Center on our way back to the Convention Center. Time: 4 hours.

Oregon Coast Tour - Wednesday and Friday (9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.). At the mouth of the Columbia River, where it empties into the Pacific Ocean, the first settlement in Oregon, Astoria, will be waiting to welcome you. You will visit the Astoria Column which overlooks the city. Climbing the stairway to the top will be up to the individual; some people thrive on challenges! Making our way down through the historical residential area, examples of early architecture are apparent. We will stop and tour one of the finest maritime museums in the northwest. Continuing on to Fort Clatsop, a stop will be made to view the winter encampment of the Lewis and Clark Expedition. You will then travel south along the Pacific Coast Highway to Seaside. Here you may stroll along the beach or boardwalk while enjoying the pounding surf of the Pacific Ocean. We will cross the Coast Mountain Range on our way back to Portland. (A boxed lunch is included.) Time: Approxim ately 8 hours.

Wine Country Tour - Wednesday and Friday (9:00 a.m. to $2: 00$ p.m.). It is easy to see what makes Oregon's scenery so special. On our winery tours, we see rolling hills, beautiful farmlands, well-manicured orchards, world-class wineries, and picturesque vineyards. We will visit two wineries for a guided, narrated tour of the processing plant, visit the charming tasting rooms, and browse through the gift shops. While motoring through the lovely valleys, Mt. Hood is ever visible in the distance. (A boxed lunch is included to be enjoyed on the winery grounds.) Time: 5 hours.
Mount St. Helens Tour - Wednesday through Saturday (9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.). This is an adventure you won't want to miss! On the morning of May 18, 1980, the peaceful serenity of the Cascade Mountains was shattered by a massive volcanic eruption. Within seconds, a 156 -square-mile swath lay devastated and ash billowed 11 miles into the pristine blue sky. Words cannot describe the stark beauty that greets your arrival. Millions of trees lying on the ground like match sticks, a new Spirit Lake has been formed, and the vast crater dominates the scene. All is as it was on that day, but in testament to nature's durability, wildlife, and plants are already reappearing. Make sure you camera has plenty of film in it, because you will want to share your many experiences with others. (A boxed lunch is included.) Time: 6 hours.

Mt. Hood and Columbia Gorge Thursday and Saturday (9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.). Treat yourself to one of the most outstanding excursions in the Pacific Northwest through a scenic wonderland. This snow-capped majesty dominates the horizon as you leave the valley and enter the forest-covered slopes of the Cascade Mountains. You will follow the historic Barlow Trail to Government Camp. From here it is just a few miles to Timberline Lodge, built during the great depression, located at the 6,000 -foot level of Oregon's highest mountain peak. You will have time to photograph the local scenery, or maybe play in the summer snow. Departing Mt. Hood, you will be passing through the famous apple and pear orchards of the Hood River Valley. The town of Hood

River has recently been recognized as the windsurfing capital of the world. A stop will be made in Hood River to allow time for lunch and sight-seeing on your own. Your return trip to Portland, west along the Columbia River, offers and opportunity to view the Columbia Gorge. Time: 8 hours.
Capacity for all tours is limited. The pre-registration deadline for all tours is May 15. Transportation for all tours will be on air conditioned motorcoaches with informative drivers and guides.

We are deeply saddened by the death of our dear caller and friend, Buck Fish. We feel so very lucky to have had Buck as our teacher and friend. All of us who have been touched by Buck's magical charm and patient training have been blessed with a great gift. Being such a natural as a teacher and dancer, Buck made the most difficult lessons fun. He

had such a patient manner and he never tired of repeating and demonstrating the correct procedure for a difficult call. Buck always made strangers and beginners feel welcome and comfortable.

Buck's life was centered around the square dance world and he will always be remembered for his endless contributions to the cause of square dancing as founder, teacher, caller, entertainer, and missionary in inspiring new dancers to join the ranks. He felt that it was imperative to gain new members if we are to keep square dancing alive. No matter how weak or ill Buck became in his last days, his thoughts were about square dancing and how he might be able to help beginners and encourage new dancers to join.

Never once during our many conversations, did we hear Buck utter an unkind word or remark about anyone. He frequentiy remarked that he heid no grudge against any person. He added that people have their reasons for their actions, good or bad, and he did not feel it was his place to judge.

Buck has passed away, but his spirit will be with the square dance world forever. When we turn left instead of right, we may just feel a little nudge as he taps us with his sponge bat. Buck is probably very busy organizing a square dance in Heaven. And we know very well that he is enjoying the rewards of Heaven after enduring so much suffering and always maintaining the highest integrity as he travelled the journey of life.

The poem printed below was taken from a plaque on the wall of Buck's home where he held his classes. We printed it previously on another occasion, but we feel it bears repeating as it describes Buck to a "T".
"Once in a while we meet someone, Someone who flies higher and faster and farther,
Than we ever thought possible, And helps us do the same. Someone like Buck!"

On your placemats with a crayon pencil, draw a broken line about $11 / 2$ inches from the edge. This will make it look like denim. Then, out of another piece of light blue placemat or construction paper, cut a square 4 " $\times 4$ " and paste only three edges of the square to the left-hand side of the placemat. This will form a pocket for your napkin. Be sure to paste the pocket low enough to accomodate the napkin so it does not go above the top of the placemat.

Next, cut out a boot shape, whatever size you like. Then, type or write your menu on a piece of paper and paste it on the boot. (Leave a blank space on the menu to put the person's name.)

Serve beef barbecue, some call it a Sloppy Joe, corn on the cob, baked beans, etc. It's your choice. Try to make it Country Western oriented. Do your own thing.

This idea can be used for smali or large groups. Don't forget to list your utensils on your list, as you eat with whatever you choose.
