The dance to benefit the Friends of the Handicapped is our big fundraiser, plus donations from the food. It makes it a big day of the year for us.


My prayer is that you, the square dancers, will stay with us and aid our work. No one gets paid, and so many helped persons are thankful for your great help.



Notices will hopefully be sent out by the end of October. It is anticipated that there will be an increase in dues. Hopefully, it will only be a nickel.

It has been brought to my attention that some injured dancers do not know what procedure to follow:

1. Call your insurance chairman immediately to report your accident.

2. A form will be sent to you which has to be completed by you and returned to the insurance chairman.

3. File the claim with your own insurance company and the square dance insurance will pick up any remaining balance.

4. After the initial report, you will deal directly with the insurance company.

If the above procedure is followed, it should eliminate many problems. All club officers should familiarize themselves with this procedure.

Please remember that all parades, one nighters, and demos should be reported to the insurance chairman for insurance coverage of your dancers.



We feel that these newsletters have been a definite plus for the students.




RUTHIE'S SEWING BASKET

As I promised, I'm back with a game that could be played along the same lines as last issue's topic — Mystery Dinner.

When handing out the menu boot to each person and asking them to select their choice, be sure to tell them to use a pencil and not to change anything once they made their selection. After they have eaten, collect the menu boot from each person being sure they have been signed. Ask one or several people (depending on the size of your group) to help you check what choices have been made. The one with the most correct items compared to your list that you have kept a secret until now will be the winner and will receive a small prize. Then you can give the menu boots back to each person, so they can compare them with each other.

Here is another fun game to keep your party or get-together moving. Try to plan ahead. A few days before your party/picnic gather items such as burlap bags, old tableclothes, curtains, jeans, wigs, mustaches, rope ribbons, all kinds of hats. toys, dolls, balloons, cosmetics, shoes. gloves, flowers, artificial vegetables, neck ties, string, and anything else that you might think of. Put all these items in boxes and set them aside. After everyone has eaten, choose teams of three or four people and choose one of them as a model. Then give a signal for all the teams to rush to the boxes and select items that they want to dress their model in. (Try to stay with the Hillbilly/Frontier theme as much as possible.) Usher each team to an area where they won't be seen and give them each 10 to 15 minutes to dress their model. They can come back to get more items during their time limit. Then give a prize for the fun-



niest, most original, and prettiest model.

The guests who have not participated so far may act as judges. Choose the winner by applause. This way everyone gets into the act. Have the models parade around your guests. Give every member of each team a small prize for their efforts. Also pass out small goodies to the judges for doing their part. This way everyone is included.

For some, the sociability and friendliness is more important than the steps. For others, it is the music that gives them pleasure. For still others, it is the challenge of executing more complex steps and figures. It obviously is inappropriate to say that one group has the only answer or is better than another group. The bottom line is to enjoy the program you have chosen and learn to do it well. Studies of human nature tell us that people enjoy most that which they do well.

There is no law that says one must move "up". Unfortunately, there are those who still think in terms of levels and equate higher numbers with higher quality. That is not how it is. There are many dancers who dance Mainstream and/or Phase II and do so with good execution and styling, who can be considered better dancers than some who fake it at Advanced and/or Phases V and VI. As an old singing call suggested, "Do What You Do Well," and ENJOY!
