


BUCKINGHAM DANCERS: We will be dancing on September 18, October 2, October 16, and October 30.



INSURANCE REPORT

Well, it is that time of year again. Vacations are almost over and it is time to think about renewing your square dance insurance again.

To obtain square dance insurance you must be a member of the Federation. As far as it can be determined, there will be a nickle increase in the yearly rate. The insurance will probably cost \$2.25 per person.

All accidents must be reported to the Insurance Chairman within 20 days to be covered by this insurance. Square dance

insurance is secondary or third-party insurance, but do not wait to report the accident.

SITES TO SEE ON YOUR WAY TO THE 44TH NATIONAL

How can you describe the South? It leaves an indelible impression on visitors from its natural beauty to an abiding sense of history.

North of Alabama are the Great Smoky Mountains of Tennessee. A historically enlightening and beautifully scenic drive, the Trail of Tears route, beginning 15 miles east of Chattanooga and follows the trail of some 13,000 Cherokee Indians uprooted over a century and a half ago and marched to Oklahoma.




GROUND RULES FOR "BANNER STEALING"

- A Banner may be captured at any regularly scheduled Club dance by a visiting Club having two or more squares present.
- 2. All visitors must be registered in the guest book and must be wearing their Club badges.

- 3. Couples who belong to more than one Club cannot represent one Club and steal a Banner from another to which they belong.
- 4. A Club may "steal" a Banner or retrieve a Banner on a Club visit but not both at once. It takes a visit to steal and a visit to retrieve.
- 5. When there is more than one visiting Club having at least two squares present, the Club that has at least two squares registered first in the host Club's guest book is entitled to the Banner. (This is to prevent discrimination against small Clubs.)
- 6. In the event the host Club's Banner has already been captured and is thus not available, the host Club shall give the visiting Club a raincheck and as soon as convenient after it recaptures its own Banner, must deliver it to the Club holding the raincheck. If two squares accompany the Banner, it may be taken home again from that same dance. Otherwise, it must be recaptured according to Rule No. 7.
- 7. A Banner may be recaptured at any of the next three scheduled dances or by one square if beyond the three-scheduled dance time limit. After ten scheduled dances, the Banner may be recaptured by any one or more couples visiting the captor Club.
- 8. A Banner may be captured only one time (by the same Club) within a dancing year (September to September).
- 9. A Club is allowed to have a Traveling Banner which must be a reasonable facsimile of the Master Banner.
- 10. A Club having a Traveling Banner will not display its Master Banner while the traveling one is in the possession of another Club.
- 11. The capturing Club agrees to exercise good care of the captive Banner and to have it available at the dance when the members of its Club come to take it home.
- 12. Any Club not wishing to participate in Banner Stealing should make this known to the District Secretary, and it will be duly noted in the Club News Section of the District Publication.

RUTHIE'S SEWING BASKET

Let's start the season off by discussing square dance apparel. This information will be directed toward the new dancer.

First, we'll talk about the woman's dress which is the most eye catching, no matter where she is dancing. Here are a few guidelines:

From real fancy to plain, from a simple dress pattern to a fancier style pattern, and then there are your square dance style skirts and blouses.

The Dress can be bought from a square dance shop or made by yourself giving it your personal touch. The length

of the dress should be somewhere around your knee. This is your choice. Some like it shorter than others. It is also popular to make your partner's outfit match your own.

The Petticoat is worn under the dress or skirt and is usually very full and a little bit shorter (about 1 inch) than the dress. It can be white or match the color of the dress. Petticoats can be purchased at various square dance shops in different lengths, sizes, and colors.

Pettipants come in all different colors to match your outfit. They also come in all different lengths (short, mid-length, and long) as well as sizes.

Shoes come in most colors too, but gold, silver, and white seem to be the most popular. Shoe heels also vary in height, from flat to very high. Shoes are a very important part of your outfit as they must have soft leather soles to feel comfortable.

All of the above items may be purchased in various square dance shops.

SQUARE DANCE - AMERICAN FOLK DANCE OF THE STATES

In 1993, Legacy's efforts to further Square Dancing as the American Folk Dance were met with mixed reactions, due in part to the economy, natural disasters, and other more pressing events. Against these odds, a total of 18 states have approved legislation making Square Dancing and its allied dance forms their American Folk Dance, bringing the total of approving states to 38%.

Colorado dancers, with the help of their legislators, proved the ACLU wrong by becoming the 17th state to approve such legislation. Arizona with the leadership of Lyle Morrow has had SB1038 passed out of committee. Square dancers in Arizona should do all within their power to have their legislators vote in favor of the bill. Mel Tyler is making

every effort to have a bill submitted in 1994, designating Square Dancing the Folk Dance of Connecticut, as are Al & Doris Moffett in Nebraska. Dick & Linda Peterson of Maryland, Paul & Gennie Lee Kirby of Mississippi, and Laverne & Barbara Harrelson of South Carolina are currently guiding bills through their respective states. Lloyd & Cherie Mergel are backing a bill to be submitted to the North Dakota legislators.

Clay & Val Harris of Minnesota, Jack & Ruth Armstrong of Michigan, and Bob & Dottie Elgin of Pennsylvania are actively involved in their various states and would welcome any backing their dancers can give them. Gene & Charlotte Johnson of Wisconsin have recently been involved in a hearing covering this subject.

So far there has been no 1994 activity in Alabama, Georgia, Hawaii, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maine, Missouri, Nevada, New Hampshire, New York, Ohio, Rhode Island, South Dakota, and Wyoming. If anyone in these states is willing to actively lobby for legislation to make Square Dancing the Folk Dance of their state, please contact Frank & Helen Cavanaugh. 20 Wooten Drive, Southampton, NJ 08088. They will be more than willing to give you all the help you need.

As soon as more states have approved such legislation, a delegation will go to Washington, D.C. to obtain national legislation making Square Dancing and its allied forms the American Folk Dance of the United States of America, for all time.

Let us all get involved in this project to give our activity the national recognition it deserves.


REMEMBER US?


