



## IS THIS YOUR FIRST NATIONAL CONVENTION?

If the 44th National Convention in Birmingham, AL will be your first convention, well guess what? There will be many first-timers to keep you company.

The last time Alabama hosted the National Convention was in 1985 with an attendance of 17,781. For many dancers, this is a once-in-a-lifetime experience, since it takes place close to home approximately every 10 to 12 years.

Some of the many fun things you will get to enjoy are dancing to different callers, a fashion show, educational panels, exhibition groups, vendors for your shopping convenience, trail-end dances, after-parties, door prizes, tours, and much more.

When you register for the 44th National Convention, be sure to order a Program Book and a Bus Pass. The Program Book costs \$3.00 (increases to \$5.00 after April 30, 1995, subject to availability). The Bus Pass is essential to getting around town and costs \$15.00 (\$25.00 after April 30, 1995). If you preregister, both will be in your registration Even when all safety rules are followed, accidents can and do happen — witness the five injuries that have occured in our Federation so far in 1994.

Our insurance program provides \$1,000,000 Liability and \$10,000 Accident/ Medical coverage. More and more property owners are demanding Certificates of Additional Insurance covering activities in or on their private facilities. This is also provided at no extra cost.

It is not too early to plan for your insurance coverage. A deadline of November 30, 1994 has been established in order to provide for the needs of clubs who have commitments in the very early weeks of January 1995.

The best information we have as of this early date: the new fee will be \$2.25 per person (only a five cent increase over 1994) and the rule still holds — "for a club to be insured each roster member must join the program". Class members are covered free of charge.

Each District within the Federation will have an Insurance Chairman, knowledgeable of the program, and it is recommended that each club appoint a member to handle it's own paperwork.

Complete details will be published, and forms will be available in the coming months.





Our callers seem reluctant to comment about it lest they offend someone. Yet, we do have a prescribed dress code which is indicative of our dance. Square dancing is not just ANY dance. It's a tradition; a proud one. Do we want to see it eroded?


