



If you don't know what your ten digit "Zip + 4" code is, just call your local post office, check your bills, or look through your junk mail to get the last four digits.







Statue of Liberty). Since Vulcan is on the crest of a mountain, he surveys the City of Birmingham from an elevation of nearly 600 feet.

Also enjoy Cobb Lane, a quaint pedestrian shopping area; historic Five Points South, Birmingham's premiere dining and entertainment district; the Birmingham Civil Rights Institute; the University of Alabama at Birmingham covering 70 city blocks and including the UAB Medical Center, recently ranked as one of the nation's three best medical centers; and Birmingham's City Center, rich in architecture, civic landmarks, manicured parks and tree-lined streets.


WHY ANGELS? WHY DO WE NEED THEM?
