## THE IMPORTANCE OF ATTENDING CALLER SCHOOL

Stan Burdick, who is a Callerlab accredited Caller/Coach and who has been conducting caller schools, seminars and clinics for many years, suggests that both brand new and seasoned callers should plan to attend accredited caller schools when possible. Why? For several reasons. First, to keep up-to-date on new ideas and methods; second, to get new enthusiasm for the tasks and joys involved in calling; and third, to gain a thorough grounding in all fundamental
aspects of the calling profession. The profession changes, just as square dancing changes, and keeping abreast of these changes is important. A one-week or part-week school can also be considered a get-away business/vacation experience if the time is right.

Clubs who want to show appreciation to a veteran caller or help a new caller become better might help with a partial scholarship to one of the many available schools.

Stan has set up three school in three sections of the United States for 1995. The first will be held from June 11-16 in Auburn, Indiana (near Fort Wayne) for new and experienced callers. Stan and Don Taylor will be the staff callers for this international school, which has been attended by callers from several countries.

The second school will be held in northern New York in Hague on Lake George on July 5-8 in the air conditioned community center. This school is especially set up for newer and would-be callers.

The third school, set up for November 6-10, will be held in Melbourne, Florida for both new and experienced callers. Stan will teach this school with Jerry Reed.

It was ironic that the educational seminar that Legacy presented in conjunction with the National Executive Committee at the National Convention in Portland, OR, entitled "Dancing for the Health of It" had a serious health problem. The session began with a discussion
on emergency preparedness and various emergency situations as well as suggested procedures to follow. Questions included: Does your club maintain (and always have available) a current listing of members trained in CPR or who are nurses, doctors, members of ambulance squads or trained in EMT? Do you know who to call for emergencies? Where is the phone located? Do you need money to place a call? Who is in charge in case of an emergency? What is ECMA - the Emergency Call for Medical Aid? How does ECMA work? What follow-up to emergency situations does your club follow?

Also discussion as this session were "Sunshine" chairmen responsible for keeping in touch with missing dancers. Another told of the "emergency repair kit" (including an eyeglass screw kit) their club always placed in both the men's and women's bathrooms at their dances.

The session then concentrated on the healthful benefits of the square dancing
activity with Jim Connelly, RN, NA, concentrating on weight loss and fitness tips. While no one there had a surefire method to develop the willpower necessary to avoid those delicious refreshments so many clubs serve at their dances, it was heartening to hear that veggie platters and healthier foods are becoming more popular.

## RUTHIE'S SEWING BASKET

Are you doing a lot of sewing or just letting your sewing machine sit there? Whatever your practice is, the following could be of interest to you in the care of your machine.

No matter how old your sewing machine is, carefully and thoroughly read through your instruction booklet. Your exceptionally finished product depended on a well kept machine that is in good condition.

If your sewing machine dealer offers lessons, take advantage of this even if you are an experienced sewer. He may also demonstrate your machine to you if you request it.

## I Need Your Advice:

After more than 27 years working in an office building, with very few windows, usually permanently sealed, in rather small cubicles, coordinating various car-pools, commuting 30 to 60 minutes each way, I'm considering the possibility of working at home.

I'm an experienced Senior Softwear Engineer, responsible for the design, implementation, debugging, testing, documentation, enhancement, and support of supervisor and job control functions, written in assembler and higher-level language for small and medium-sized business computer operating systems.

Do you know anyone who works at home? What kind of work do they do? Do they telecommute? How much of their work week is spent at home? Do you think they would be willing, to discuss with me, the pros and cons of working out of my home?

Check all your controls before starting to sew and oil your machine periodically to help keep your machine running smoothly and quietly. Be sure to wipe off all excess oil no matter how small, then check for oil after it sets a while. Then prevents oil from getting on your nice new dress or whatever you are sewing.

Set directly in front of your needle when sewing and make sure your machine is located in a well lit area so you are not working in your own shadow.

When adjusting the needle height, always turn the hand wheel toward you, never away from you. Also, when removing fabric from the machine, the take up lever should be at its highest point.

If you have trouble threading your needie, try holding a piece of white cardboard behind the needle so you can see the eye more clearly.

Treat your sewing machine with respect and make sewing a pleasure.
