## RUTHIE'S SEWING BASKET

As this is the beginning of a new season, we'll try to get ready for the fall, if you haven't already done so.

Try to choose fall colors for a change in pace when making you square dance attire.

Check into your patterns, perhaps modifying your already used ones. Change the neckline or add a ruffle on the skirt for instance.

Take one of the solid colored dresses that you have already made and been wearing and using a printed material, give it a new look by adding some trim to it, such as a ruffle here or there (skirt, bodice or sleeve trim). You could also add a printed self-made belt or sash. Or do the reverse procedure by using a plain material on a printed dress. Use an overskirt of lace or eyelet material.

The above procedure can be used for a man's shirt as well by adding a printed yoke, pockets and cuffs sewn over the original with care or a little trim on the
edge. Give it a try, you may come up with something very surprising and original.

Be sure to pre-shrink your new material before using it on an already worn and washed garment.

Using blend materials are much easier to work with and usually do not require ironing. Stay away from $100 \%$ cotton materials.

Also watch for sales on all types of trim. Buy up what you can each time and you will always be ready for your next project.

## CORRECT ZIP CODES

We are requesting that everyone submit their up-to-date ten digit zip codes to their club leaders. The post office is using "Zip +4 ," which is making delivery easier and much faster. If the four digit part of your zip code is not in our records, your mail may be delayed by the post office.

Here is how to do it. Use your standard five digit zip code, add a hyphen, and then add your new four digit code. It should look something like this: 123456789.

If you don't know what you ten digit " $Z i p+4$ " code is, just call your local post office, check you bills, or look through your junk mail to get the last four digits.

We suggest that everyone use their new ten digit zip code on everything they mail so the post office does not delay your mail delivery.
