By now most of the clubs should have returned their insurance forms to me. It takes at least six weeks for your insurance certificates to be returned to me. As you were warned, the insurance dues were raised a nickle. The dues are now $\$ 2.30$ per person.

Please consider carrying insurance for your own protection and for the protection of your club. Your club also receives liability coverage as well as medical coverage.

To be eligible for this insurance coverage, each club must have 100\% participation in the Federation.

## CORRECT ZIP CODES

We are requesting that everyone submit their up-to-date ten digit zip codes to their club leaders. The post office is using "Zip + 4," which is making delivery easier and much faster. If the four digit part of your zip code is not in our records, your mail may be delayed by the post office.

Here is how to do it. Use your standard five digit zip code, add a hyphen, and then add your new four digit code. It should look something like this: 123456789.

If you don't know what your ten digit
"Zip + 4" code is, just call your local post office, check on your bills, or look through your junk mail to get the last four digits.

We suggest that everyone use their new ten digit zip code on everything they mail so the post office does not delay your mail delivery.

Discussion then ensued regarding the use of the $\$ 10,000.00$; the following motion was made by Marion Goerlich and seconded: "The $\$ 10,000.00$ be put in escrow in the event that the Federation has to default, at any future date, on the Federation Convention."

Ron Smith stated that President Elect, Mitch \& Carin Cytacki, voted positively for the ' 96 Weekend and Burris \& Meryl Plummer were introduced as Chairpersons of the Weekend.

New Officers: The new Federation officers are: President, Mitch \& Carin Cytacki; Vice President, Bernie \& Joan Lechner; Treasurer, Jim \& Sally Guenther; and Secretary, Tom \& Karen Vogler.


New Chairpersons: The new Committee Chairpersons are Insurance, Charlie \& Dorothy Seymour; Education, Lou \& Ruth Wagenheiser; Membership, Tom \& Lyn Bailey; and Publicity, Herb \& Connie Garber.

35th Convention: Meryl Plummer gave a brief description of the progress of the Convention and that, in spite of the short notice, the Committee has been chosen, a theme picked and staff hired. Nicknaming this convention the "K-Mart" of conventions, the actual name of the convention will be "Del-Val Mountain Weekend."

Wildwood Weekend: Regarding Wildwood Weekend dates, the following were tentative dates: April 26-28, 1996; April 25-27, 1997; April 24-26, 1998; April 23-25, 1999; and April 28-30, 2000.

National Convention: At the National Convention, on June 22 at 7:00 p.m., the Federation recieved the Organization Round Table Certificate of Merit for 25 years of entering the Showcase of ideas. Joe Mathers accepted the award for the Federation.

At the National Convention, on June 23 at 9:00 a.m., the announcement took place that Baltimore bid for the 49th National Convention in the year 2000.


## USA WEST CONVENTION

The first USA West Square Dance Convention planning is underway and will be held in Denver, CO on August 6-9, 1997.

Pres \& Kay Minnick and Sam \& Linda Margheim are Co-Chairmen of the Convention. The "Mile-Hi Board" consists of ten Director Couples and representatives all of Colorado.

The USA West Policy Board is almost

# RUTHIE'S SEWING BASKET 

by Ruth McLay

With the holidays fast approaching, perhaps you would like to add some ruffles on one of your favorite dresses or skirts. Ruffies added to hemlines or yokes are called flounces.

Ruffles or flounces come in many varieties. Here are a few thoughts to think about.

Ruffles can be wide or narrow. They can be hemmed on both edges or only one edge or folded in half with no hem. Ruffles can also be cut on the bias or straight grain of the fabric.

When gathering ruffles, use a different color thread in your bobbin. This makes it easier to know which thread to pull when gathering. You could also learn to use the ruffle attachment or make little pin tucks with a needle as you sew slowly on the machine, but practice first! Long lengths of ruffles can be more easily gathered if done in sections. If a thread breaks, only one section would have to be redone.

Ruffles can be made in single rows, double rows or more. They look the prettiest when they are gathered twice as full as the edge they are being sewn to. At least one-and-a-half times as full is the

Lightweight fabrics look best as ruffles. Also, look at finished curtains for ideas to adding ruffles. Watch for sales on eyelet edging and laces in various widths and colors that are already gathered. Keep your eye out for remnants and ends of bolts, too.
