## RUTHIE'S SEWING BASKET

Hopefully everyone had a most pleasant and enjoyable holiday season. Now that 1996 is here, once again we'll get down to new and old routines.

Have you ever made a written record of your own figure (gals and guys) when making your own garments? These measurements are very important. Make sure you check from time to time to see if they have changed.

A dress or skirt that hangs loose, fits as poorly as one that is to tight. Also, a dress or skirt that is to long distracts from the beauty of the garment, as well as one that is to short. A gapping neckline is very uncomfortable and doesn't look good.

Square dance clothing should feel good, fit properly and be comfortable. A well fitted dress (or shirt) makes you feel like the prettiest gal (and guy) at the dance. So... take your measurements!

Compare your measurements with standard patterns. If your measurements fall within the pattern listings, you won't have any problems. If they don't, then get a pattern closest to your measurements and make adjustments accordingly on your pattern. Make sure to fit the pattern
to yourself before cutting out your material. Don't forget to allow for movement.

A few simple alterations on your pattern will save a lot of ripping our and expedite your sewing. Good luck!
