## INSURANCE NOTES

by Marian McKinney

A change has just been received from the USDA Insurance Coordinator affecting the enrollment procedure to be followed when new members join an existing club. Effective immediately, all new members will be covered by the club's insurance until the next renewal date
(January 1st) without the payment of any additionai insurance premiums.

The insurance payment rules are as follows:
(1) For the period January 1 through January 31 of each year, all additional members joining an existing club will be required to pay the full yearly insurance premium in effect at the time of enroilment.
(2) For the period February 1 through December 31, a new member joining an existing club will be insured automatically, without the payment of an insurance premium, until the next enrollment period.

All other procedures will remain in effect as previously established by USDA policy. It is essential to remember that a person applying for insurance must be a member of the Federation (have a Federation membership card) and must be a member of a Federation club. Without the dual membership, insurance coverage cannot be granted.

## GROUND RULES FOR BANNER STEALING

1) A banner may be captured at any regularly scheduled club dance by a visiting club having two or more squares present.
2) All visitors must be registered in the guest book and must be wearing their club badges.
3) Couples who belong to more than one club cannot represent one club and steal a banner from another to which they belong.
4) A club may steal a banner or retrieve a banner on a club visit, but not both at once. It takes a visit to steal and a visit to retrieve.
5) When there is more than one visiting club having at least two squares present, the club that has at least two squares registered first in the host clubs guest book is entitled to the banner. (This is to prevent discrimination against small clubs.)
6) In the event that the host club's
banner has already been captured and is not available, the host club shall give the visiting club a raincheck. As soon as convenient after they recapture their own banner, they must deliver it to the club holding the raincheck. If two squares accompany the banner, it may be taken home again from that same dance. Otherwise, it must be recaptured according to Rule \#7.
7) A banner may be recaptured at any of the next three scheduled dances of the captor club by two squares or by one square if beyond the three scheduled dance time limit. After ten scheduled dances, the banner may be recaptured by any one or more couples visiting the captor club.
8) A banner may be captured only one time (by the same club) within a dancing year (September to September).
9) A ciub is allowed to have a traveling banner which must be a reasonable facsimile of the master banner.
10) A club having a traveling banner will not display its master banner while the traveling one is in the possession of another club.
11) The capturing club agrees to exercise good care of the captive banner and to have it available at the dance when the members of it's club come to take it home.
12) Any club not wishing to participate in banner stealing should make this
known to the District Secretary, and it will be duly noted in the club news section of the District publication.

## THE HISTORY OF SQUÁRE DÂNCING

A history is a recounting of the past. Very often we refer to ancient history and/or modern history. If we want to talk about the ancient history of square dancing, we can return to the mythological period where man was either fighting off or trying to attract the Gods for one or more reasons. In such primitive forms of dancing, the percussion instruments drums, rattles or wooden rods -- were used to keep rhythm. Do you see the effect of ancient history? How many times has it been said, "That caller, that tune, that record, etc. has a good beat." History, but in a different form, is being repeated.

From the primitive we move forward to the European history of folk dances. The minuet was artistically perfected in Versailles, France. Popular English dances were converted by the French into quadrilles and lancers. The allemande was developed from a folk dance when the

French armies occupied Germany during the Seven Years' War. Naturally, the European folk dances followed the settlers to America. The folk dances had the distinction that the same dance was done to the same music every time. Very little was recorded on paper but retained in the minds of the dancers as it had been handed down. As the settlers in the New World improvised, there were times when the dancers forgot the next step or figure; and one of the dancers would call out a brief "cue" and, as time passed, became known as a "caller outer." Our history has now established the creation of a "caller." The dance moved with the pioneers. Individual interpretations of the dance and dancing changed, probably for the worse, as the pioneers were at the least vigorous, energetic and, yes, even rough. In spite of this, the dance continued through history.

Henry Ford, yes, the Henry Ford, is credited for the revival and popularity of square dancing today. It is generally accepted that, despite tracing its roots
back to the quadrilles and cotillions of the royal courts of France and England, it was slowly headed for extinction until 1923. Henry Ford met Benjamin Lovette, a dance master and instructor teaching gavottes, mazurkas and reels, together with what we now refer to as traditional square dancing. Henry Ford became so enthusiastic about square dancing that he began to introduce the art form as zealously as he had introduced his Model T. Approximately at the same time, a man named Lloyd "Pappy" Shaw was teaching and reintroducing square dancing in Colorado Springs, CO. In the 1930's, 1940's and 1950's, his Cheyenne Dancers traveled the world giving square dance exhibitions and spreading the popularity of this newly recreated dance form.

From this history, square dancing has developed to the point we know it today. As it stands, we have the opportunity to become part of the history of square dancing. It is agreed that we are standardized throughout the world; but yet,

It is interesting and inexpensive, a great continuous social event and worthwhile our support. If history is a record of the past, we can become a part of history. If we continue to square dance, and if we all do our part, square dancing may someday be known as our "American Folk Dance."
