## FROM THE CHAIR

Mid-East Penn District Chairmen
The Delaware Valley Federation has raised the dues charged to each District from $\$ 1.00$ to $\$ 5.30$ per couple. This increase will cover operating expenses including the cost of the "Freedom Valley Dancer" minus ads, subscriptions and benefit dances.

Mid-East Penn dues may be raised only at our annual meeting. Our current dues structure of $\$ 8.00$ per couple and $\$ 4.50$ per single breaks down this way. $\$ 6.00$ covers the cost of "Squares and

Rounds", \$1.00 is for Delaware Valley Federation dues, and $\$ 1.00$ is for MidEast Penn operating expenses such as the Membership Dance, postage, the "Student News", etc.

After paying this increase, we will have only $\$ 2.70$ to go toward the cost of "Squares and Rounds" and our operating expenses.

ALL District members attending the annual March Meeting will have the opportunity to decide how they want future dues to be collected and spent by the District.

## WHAT GOOD IS LEGACY?

The other day a square dancer said, "Tell me about Legacy. What does it do? Is it an organization to document the history of square dancing?"
"Much more than that," we replied. "In fact, that's probably the least of the functions of Legacy. Here is the whole story."

Square dancing, just as any type pf activity, needs a "check and balance" system. Documentation is one thing, but steadying the course of an activity - urging an effective direction - is another. That was its purpose at the beginning in 1973, and it's still Legacy's role today. For instance, every year at the National Convention, Legacy chairs a Summit Meeting in which leaders of every representative national and international organization of square dancing assess what's happening in the activity and recommend changes.

Similarly, at Legacy's biennial assembly of trustees (members), much exploration of "where we're going" takes place, and resolutions will be put forth. These conferences are veritable "think tanks" for square dancing. Approximately

100 leaders will meet in Salt Lake City next May for that purpose.

You've heard that Legacy attempts to "promote, preserve and perpetuate the activity". That's an apt description. For over ten years, Legacy has conducted surveys biannually to examine the shape and structure of square dancing, its appeal, its numbers, and its potential. Through its annual Promo-Pak, better promotion of classes is encouraged.

Legacy's big function is promoting better leadership within the ranks of local and regional organizations. To end this, dozens of Mini-Legacys have sprung up in many areas to bring together local leaders for training - a grassroots effort to create better local club activity. A special handbook of instructions is available from Legacy for use by these groups.

Perhaps you know that Legacy is a "communications resource". News and feature releases come from Legacy's office is Wisconsin and go to all publications to inform the square dance public. A monthly bulletin, the Club Leadership Journal, is available by subscription and deals with better leadership, promotional methods, and current resources. The quarterly Legacy Log goes to the membership.

A "hotline" to coordinate efforts to curb danger elements in the activity (ads that portray square dancing in a poor light, for example) has been active for many years and has been effective in starting a chain reaction of protest calls and letters in several instances.

At every National Convention, Legacy conducts a number of educational panels that have provided valuable leadership training. These same kinds of panels have been incorporated into area festivals and conventions as well, and into the Canadian National Conventions.

Over the years, Legacy has taken a major role in creating widespread new developments. The impetus to create Roundalab started with Legacy. In the same way, the National Association of Square and Round Dance Suppliers formed a group meeting at an early Legacy conclave. Legacy encouraged Callerlab to form a Record Producers

Clearing House. Callerlab's CDP was strongly pushed. Jointly, with the U.S. Dancers Assciation, the American Folk Dance legislation was promoted. Until now, 28 states have adopted State Dances. Several resolutions promoted acceptance of prairie skirts as alternatives to the prevalent square dance attire. Smoke-free dance halls have been encouraged. Leadership training programs are continually promoted.

Legacy is unique in that it doesn't attempt to create a top heavy organization with thousands of members. A "think tank" needs to be small. There are fewer than 200 trustees (members), plus a number of affiliates. It's an umbrella organization with representatives of ten segments of the activity, including square dance callers, round dance cuers, dancers, suppliers, and others.

What good is Legacy? Unquestionably good!
