## WHAT IS A MINI-LEGACY?

Leadership training is a never ending task. Developing, guiding and encouraging new leaders, giving them confidence in their abilities, and helping them to see the overall picture -- these are important contributions that one can make to our square dance activity. Helping the more experienced leaders prevent burn-out should not be overlooked as a vital part of this program.

Legacy members, called trustees, have been involved in leadership training since 1973 when Legacy was conceived as a Leadership, communication and resource center for the activity. Its trustees, all leaders in the square dance activity, are encouraged to share their expertise by actively participating in education, communication leadership seminars, or Mini-Legacy activities, whenever possible.

Although there are three major types of Mini-Legacys, all have several things in common. All give attendees a chance to meet other people, to become better acquainted, and share experiences and ideas that can be brought back "home" to strengthen the square dance community. Not only is it an opportunity to learn, but participants develop a special form of camaraderie and often rekindle a spark of enthusiasm for the activity. Representatives return to their clubs with their batteries recharged and with new ideas for club programs.

The most popular Mini-Legacys are the annual or biennial seminars conducted by area or state organizations. These can be weekend or one or two day seminars where dancers and callers discuss many timely topics and share ideas. A second type of MiniLegacy is found in educational programs at state, provincial and regional conventions. These are similar to the education seminars Legacy conducts at National Square Dance Conventions and they last about an hour.

A third type is sometimes referred to as a Mini-Mini-Legacy or a Micro-Legacy, as it is of much shorter duration. Sometimes they are five or ten minute educational segments between tips at classes
on dancer etiquette, area history; at area dances to report on area of state organization concerns; or twenty minutes at an association meeting to cover a topic of special importance.

Careful planning and organization of any type of Mini-Legacy is vital, but especially for the weekend or day-long seminar. Topics of concern must be chosen; knowledgeable, enthusiastic panelists and moderators must be found; and schedules must be dovetailed. Legacy publishes a manual to help in all the steps of planning and programming. Areas requesting assistance are referred to nearby Legacy trustees who can help.

If you are interested in Mini-Legacy programs or need assistance in heiping to promote leadership and guidance to revitalize our activity, contact the Legacy office at 1100 Revere Drive, Oconomowoc, WI 53066. St. Augutsine's achitecture, cobblestone streets and mighty fortresses still reflect an age of discovery. Eventually the whole world (be)came (a)round. We hope you will come 'round, too!

Ponce de Leon sighted the coast in 1513, walked ashore and since it was Eastertime and a period known as Feast of the Flowers, named the land "Pascua Florida", so Florida it became! (There's a story concerning the Fountain of Youth, but that's another story.) By 1565 , Menendez claimed the land for Spain and named the garrison town in honor of the August 28, 1565 Feast Day - St. Augustine.

St. Augutsine is unquestionably America's first city. It is the oldest, continuously occupied European settlement in what is now the United States. Fortytwo years before English colonists established Jamestown and 55 years before the pilgrams landed at Plymouth Rock, the Spanish founded St. Augustine, securing Spain's claim to Florida and provided an important strategic base for the European imperial power for nearly two-and-a-half centuries. Although the United States took possession in 1821, the Spanish influence remained strong contributing to Florida's distinctive historical character. Now fully restored, the city of St. Augustine and the old fort, called the Castillo de San Marcos, vividly bring to life this Spanish heritage of early Florida.

While many present day visitors enter Florida with an eye toward the many attractions and beautiful vistas which stretch from Pensacola in the panhandle
to the beautiful azure waters as you cross the miles of bridges on your way to the southernmost city of Ket West, many fail to realize they enter the old-est-first-land of our nation. Pause for a few hours and enter the restored areas of the nation's oldest city - St. Augustine. The 46th National Convention feels it is important enough to offer the dancers a special tour with knowledgeable guides so you may enjoy a part of your American heritage in fascinating St. Augustine, Florida.
