## CAMPING AT THE 47TH NATIONAL CONVENTION

The official campground for the 47th National Convention will be located at the Charlotte Motor Speedway a few miles north, north east of the Queen City. Remember, the 47th National Convention has no connection with these facilities and does not endorse or warranty the availability or condition of any of these facilities and there is no Convention Shuttle Bus service to these locations. Reservations must be made by the camper directly with these facilities.

## RUTHIE'S SEWING BASKET

Hi! It's been awhile since l've given you tips on sewing, but now I'm back! The following items are just a few helpful hints you can use while you are sewing. Perhaps you have already heard of some of these, so pass the word around to others.

1. Try using a glue stick to place trim on your dress before sewing.
2. Use the gentle cycle when washing your petticoat and arrange it evenly by having the agitator at the opening of the waist. After washing, lay your petticoat out on an opened unbrella to air dry.
3. To keep our thimble from slipping off your finger, first wet your finger tip with water.
4. To keep a front-wrapping skirt from flying open when you least expect it, sew a small drapery weight in the corner of
the overlap hem.
5. When making a square dance outfit, adopt only styles, designs, patterns and colors that are best suited for your body size and shape.
6. Rub excess hand lotion or cream on your pantyhose to avoid static cling problems.

# STARTING ROUND DANCING

In the fall, we usually see the start of basic round dance classes. The student's choice of a group can depend on the class being held on a "free" night, a convenient location, or the teacher's being a cuer for the student's square dance club. Most of our round dance students come from square dance clubs, and although this square dance experience is not necessary to round dancing, it would appear to be of some intangible assistance (1) in relating to the musical beat and (2) in having square dancing friends in the round dance class, rather than entering a group "cold."

What can the beginner do to make his/her round dance course easier? Firstly, one should avoid taking two types of lessons at once. During our square dance lessons over 20 years ago, we saw round dancing for the first time and, wanting to take that too, were cautioned not to do so. Now that I teach round dancing, I can appreciate the wisdom of concentrating on one course at a time. Taking two courses at once can be done, but with subtle difficulties presented and the various weaknesses ensuing may not always be apparent to the dancer. The student who graduates from mainstream square dancing, dances through the summertime, and gets a solid grounding in plus dancing is ready for round dancing.

Secondly, the round dance student should make all reasonable efforts to avoid missing lessons. To miss an early lesson or a series of lessons can be devastating to the beginner. This consideration ties in with my third point that of cassette or video recording lessons as an assist to learning. If you must miss a round dance lesson, perhaps a friend can record the class material for you. During the course of our lessons, frequently we did not have a chance to
practice, but our playing the cassette at suppertime before our class was a helpful reminder.

Lastly, how far do we go with round dancing? To start as a student does not mean that our eventual goal is the Phase VI level. There is an unfortunate human tendency (and not only in dance circles) to identify the highest with the best, or most desirable. The helpful innovation of classifying levels should not carry over into classifying dancers as "most" or "least" accomplished. How often has the reminder from our cuer (or caller) of... "Smile, this is your recreation!" brought us down to earth? Round dancing or square dancing, we should enter the activity with the goal in mind that we are going to dance the level at which we are comfortable. Such a goal is not a settling for second best; it should be a happy achievement. A teacher could ask for no more for his or her students.

## LAUGHING FOR THE HEALTH OF IT

Did you know that: "Children laugh over 400 times a day, whereas adults laugh an average of 15 times a day."

Laughter is a physical activity. When one laughs, the heart rate and blood pressure increase. After laughter subsides, the rate rops below the base rate. Energy expenditure and metabolism increase and skeletal muscle tension decreases. The respiratory rate is stimulated. Deep breathing and coughing resulting from laughter help clear the lungs and increase the blood gas exchange. Oxygen-enriched blood is then carried to the brain.

Laughter can bolster the immune system by increasing lymphocyte proliferation, natural killer of cell activity, and immune response to saliva.

Laughter decreases epinephrine and cortisol levels, both which suppress the immune system.

These positive effects of laughter on the immune system strengthen the body's ability to fight off illness for up to two days. So do yourself and your body a big favor - Smile!
