## RUTHIE'S SEWING BASKET

Hi everyone! I hope that everyone had a wonderful holiday season filled with festive food and activities.

In this article, I have listed a few hints for men's square dance apparel that should prove to be very helpful, especially for new dancers.

First, we will discuss the man's shirt, which should be western style with long sleeves. It should have pearl snap buttons down the fron of it, on the flaps of the two front pockets, and also on the
sleeve cuffs. Western shirts come in all colors and sizes, so you can always find one that will match your skirt or dress. They can also be custom made or purchased from a square dance apparel shop. (Courtesy Tip: As a courtesy to other square dancers, men should keep their sleeves down at all times with the snaps closed. Some women prefer not to grab hairy arms when dancing in a square.)

Men's slacks should also be western style. They should be well fitted, yet comfortable, and coordinate with their shirt or with their partner's outfit. Also, men should wear a belt that matches their slacks.

There are three types of ties that men can wear to accent the outfit. They are the Colonial bow tie, the boloe scarf, and the square dance scark tie secured with a tie slide. Which ever tie your man decides to wear, it should match with their outfit.

Men's shoes should be made with soft leather soles and should match or coordinate with their outfit. Of course, they must also be comfortable to dance in all evening.

Some men wear small square dance towels which hang on a small arrangement attached to their belt. These come in very handy when the hands get sweaty or for those overtaxing tips which come up once in a while.

All of the above items may be custom made with your own personal touch or purchased from a square dance apparel shop, whichever you decide to choose.

## CHARLOTTE, N.C. "The Queen City"

Over 250 years ago Scotch-Irish immigrants traveling the Great Wagon Road south from Philadelphia, stopped at the crossroads of two Indian trading paths east of the Catawba River. Here they built a settlement and as their friends and neighbors joined them, the commu-
nity grew to several hundred residents. In 1768, to curry favor with the British King, George III, they named their town after Sophia Charlotte, who at age 17 married the most powerful man in the world. Local citizens also honored Queen Charlotte hen they named their new county Mecklenberg after her german homeland. Evidently its residents didn't take their royal affiliation too seriously. When Lord Cornwallis occupied the town briefly in 1780, he was so annoyed by patriot activities, he called the town a "hornet's nest," a name that stuck and now proudly adorns the city seal.

In 1799, America's first major gold discovery was made here, a 17-pound gold nugget. The city quickly became the center of gold production in the United States and a branch of the United States mint was located here from 1837 to 1913, although it was inoperative from 1861 to 1867 because of the Civil War. In the mid-1800's, cotton flourished and railroads converged, and later, the in-
terstate highway system would evolve.
Today, the city of Charlotte still pays homage to its regal beginnings by using a crown as its logo and referring to itself as "The Queen City." A statue of our namesake welcomes passengers at our international airport. Its' citizens take great pride in treating every visitor as a royal guest.

For a visua display of Charlotte's beginnings, see the four sculptures erected at The Square - Trade and Tryon Streets. A gold miner for commerce, a woman millworker for our textile heritage, an African-American railroad builder for transportation and a mother holding a child for the future.

Charlotte is located in the sunny, moderate central region of North Carolina making us easily accessible. Interstates 77 and 85, which intersect here, link the city with the Great Lakes region, New England and Florida. Interstate 40 , running coast-to-coast is only an hour north of Charlotte. A two-hour journey to the west takes you to the beau-

## WHERE DOES MY HEAD GO?

We are sure that you have heard many "rules" as to which way you should turn you head while executing certain round dance figures. So many, in fact, that we know you will enjoy being presented with a basic rule that will cover
head positioning for every round dance figure you know, excluding only some of the more advanced English competitive ballioom dancing figures where sometimes head positioning is merely a matter of styling.

The following consideration for head positioning is purely a mechanical one. In the interest of comfortable, pleasant to watch dancing - you should always "turn you head so that you are looking in the direction of turn in the particular step or dance figure you are executing."

If you are pivoting or turning right face, you should look to your right until the head is facing in the direction it should be in when the step or figure is completed. Look to your left when turning or pivoting steps or figures have you moving left face.

NEVER look down. Looking down at your feet or even at your partner when executing turning or pivoting steps or figures is a sure way to make these same moves more difficult than they should actually be.

Beginning dancers often think that by watching their feet, learning dance steps is made easier. Actually, the opposite is true. No one feels the need to watch their feet as they walk... feet can be "thought" where to go, so don't ever look at your feet while dancing or learning new steps or figures. That just gives the brain one more thing to decipher, thereby slowing down the overall learning process.

## 洜 <br> 47TH NATIONAL GOLF TOURNAMENT

The 47th National Square and Round Dance Convention Golf Tournament is scheduled to take place on Wednesday, June 24, 1998 at the Regent Park Golf Course in Fort Mill, SC.

Regent Park is located just minutes from uptown Charotte, and will take you away from the everyday world. The course is carved from naturally rolling, wooded terrain, with fairways lined by towering oaks and pines, and beautifully accented with redbuds, dogwoods and azaleas. Played on Bermuda fairways and Bent Grass greens, the Par 72, 6,478 yard course takes golfers through two states and three counties. Each hole is distinctly separate; groups do not have to pass each other from one hole to another. Regent Park is an excellent example of golf in the Carolinas!

An adjacent 26 acre, fully lighted, practice complex includes evelvated practice tees, half acre putting green, and chipping, short iron and bunker practice areas.

The tournament players must play in four person teams playing a "Scramble" (also known as "Captain's Choice.") Players can assemble their own teams or can sign up as singles, doubles or triples and have the Golf Committee assign the remaining team members.

Handicaps will not be used during the
competition, however, teams will be preflighted based upon the toal of the players' "average score for 18 holes" (honest John system) to equalize competition. The number of flights will depend upon the total number of teams entered.

The rules of the United States Gold Association (USGA) will be applied, except as specified by the Golf Commitee and/or supplemented by Local Rules of the golf course used for the competition.

Prizes include the following areas for competition: first and second place finishes in each flight, the longest drive (separate prizes for men and women), the straightest drive (separate prizes for men and women), closest to pin (separate prizes for men and women), miscellaneous prizes, and door prizes.

Entries are open to amateur golfers who are either a registered dancers at the 47th National Convention, a spouse of a registered dancer, or other family members (over the age of 16) of a register dancer.

The cost is $\$ 64.00$ per golfer, which includes golf plus a golf cart, a boxed lunch with a beverage, pre-round range balls, and prizes. Transportation from the Charlotte Convention area can be arranged. Registration must be completed before May 8, 1998.

In the event of adverse weather, playing conditions (course playability and personal safety) will be determined by the Golf Committee in conjunction with the local golf course manager. In the event of cancellation, NO alternate rain date will be used and all registration fees will be returned.

## GROUND RULES FOR BANNER STEALING

1. A banner may be captured at any regularly scheduled club dance by a visting club having two or more squares of dancers present.
2. All visitors must be registered in the host club's guest book and must be wearing their club badges.
3. Couples who belong to more than one club cannot represent one club and steal a banner from another club to which they belong.
4. A club may steal a banner or retrieve a banner on a club visit, but not both at once. It takes one visit to steal a banner and one visit to retrieve a banner.
5. When there is more than one visiting club having at least two squares of dancers present, the club that has at least two squares of dancers registered first in the host club's guest book is entitled to capture the banner. (This is to prevent discrimination against small clubs.)
6. In the event that the host club's banner has already been captured and is not available at that time, the host club shall give the visiting club a raincheck. As soon as it is convenient after the host club recaptures their own banner, they must deliver it to the visiting club holding the raincheck. If two squares of dancers from the host club accompany the banner, it may be taken home again from the same dance. Otherwise it must be recaptured according to Rule \#7.
7. A banner may be recaptured by the host club at any of the next three scheduled dances of the captor ciub by
two squares of dancers or by one square of dancers if beyond the three scheduled dance time limit. After ten scheduled dances, the banner may be recaptured by any one or more couples visiting the captor club.
8. A banner may be captured only one time, by the same club, within a single dancing year which runs from September to September.
9. A club is allowed to have a traveling banner which must be a reasonable facsimile of the master banner which hangs in their dance hall.
10. A club having a traveling banner will not display their master banner while the traveling banner is in the possession of another club.
11. The capturing club agrees to exercise good care of the captive banner and have it available at the dance when the members of it's home club come toretrieve it.
12. Any club not wishing to partcipate in banner stealing should make this known to the District Secretary and it will be duly noted in the club news section of the District pulication.
