## GUIDELINES FOR NEW DANCERS

1. Dance At Other Clubs: Your home club needs your support and there should be a special place in your heart for the club where you learned to dance, but you are missing one of the great things about square dancing if you only dance with your home club. Visit with other clubs in the area from time to time and when on trips. But remember you are a visitor. It is suggested that you call or write before visiting as dancing schedules and locations are subject to change (this is especially important if you are traveling).
2. Belong To A Club: Clubs are needed to organize and establish a means of enjoying the fellowship of square dancing. To survive, they need an active membership where everyone helps. Volunteer, don't wait to be asked to help.
3. Dance To Other Callers: During lessons you tuned in to the caller who taught you to dance and you will always have a special place in your heart for him or her. Every caller has a different style and that is part of the fun.
4. Dance In The Front Of The Hall:

The tendency for the new dancer is to hide in the back of the dance hall where he or she thinks the caller can't see his square break down. A good caller watches the whole dance floor, including the back squares. Don't be afraid to dance in the front square.
5. Dance With Experienced Dancers: Sometimes an outreached hand from a more experienced dancer is all your square needs to keep going. Everyone dancing today was a new dancer at one time and can remember how it felt.
6. Touch Hands After Every Move: Establish your position by touching hands after every move. If you are lost, at least you will have company.
7. Keep Dancing: To use all the iniformation you have learned and to make it become second nature, it is important to practice, practice, practice.
8. Be Aware Of Your Level: Look for dances advertised at the level of dancing that you know.
9. Stay At Your Level For Awhile: The level you dance at has nothing to do with how good of a dancer you are. It has to do with how much time you are willing to devote to your hobby. You may never choose to move to another level and that is fine. Don't make a choice until you have danced mainstream for at least one full year! Don't let anyone rush you to another level!
10. Square Dance For Fun: The odds are pretty good that someone is going to make a mistake (even a caller makes one sometimes!). Don't worry about whose fault it was, it doesn't matter. Regroup and keep smiling!
11. Last But Not Least: Jump right up when the music starts. Get in the first open square... do not pass one up! Introduce yourself, smile and have fun! Thank everyone is the square when the tip is over.

Legacy is said to have come from "LEaders GAthered for Commitment and Yak."

The first Legacy meetings was called in May of 1973 in Cleveland, Ohio. The plan was for there to be representatives from all phases of square dancing. Members, who have attended a biennial meeting are called Trustees. This group is made up of dancers, square dance callers, round dance instructors, publishers, record producers, vendors, and members of other special interest groups. They hail from all areas of the

world, with trustees from 39 states, three Canadian provinces and two other countries. There is also a membership category called Affiliates. This group consists of the above mentioned individuals plus square dance clubs, associations, federations, etc. and have not attended a meeting. They have no vote, but can work on committees along with a Trustee.

The trustees meet in the odd-numbers years around the continent and discuss square dancing problems. They sometimes find possible solutions. These discussions may lead to the passing of resolutions that are distributed to the square dance world. Usually, the trustees find that problems are the same across the world. What has worked elsewhere may lead to a solution for a club problem in your area.

The Legacy Board of Directors meets each year on the Sunday morning following the National Square Dance Convention, as well as at Legacy meetings, to handle the necessary business for the organization. Some of the continuing projects of Legacy have been the censuses and surveys to find out how many dancers there are and how they will feel about various things relating to the activity, the Promo-Pak released each year to set a theme and give help in promoting square dancing, and the leadership seminars, called Mini-Legacies, which the group has helped to initiate in many areas.

From Legacy came the beginnings of Roundalab, Contralab, the National Association of Square Dance Suppliers, and The Summit, a meeting of the heads of all square dance organizations.

One of the important facts about the Legacy trustees is that they are leaders in their own niches, be they the nation-ally-known caller or the member of a local association, the local round dance instructor or the publisher of a national publication. All have an equal right of input and an equal vote.

Legacy II was also held in Cleveland, Ohio. Legacy III was held in Memphis, TN; Legacy IV in Louisville, KY; Legacy $V$ in Denver, CO; Legacy VI in St. Louis, MO; Legacy VII in Philadelphia, PA; Legacy VIII in Nashville, TN; Legacy IX
in Reno, NV; Legacy $X$ in Milwaukee, WI; Legacy XI in Toronto, Ontario, CAN; Legacy XII in Fayetteville, AR; and Legacy XIII in Salt Lake City, UT.

Legacy meetings are rotated between four sections of the United States - West, North Central, East, and South Central, and begin the Thursday following Mother's Day.

## RUTHIE'S SEWING BASKET

## MAKING A WESTERN SHIRT FOR YOUR MAN

Purchase a basic western shirt pattern closest to your man's shirt size. Measure your man's upper body accurately and then have him try on the best fitting shirt that he already has. Check the cuffs, the length of the sleeves, and how the shoulders fit. Study these details well before you start.

After doing all of the aforementioned details, try to fit the pattern to the shirt or to your man. Be prepared to make small tucks in the pattern to take out needed fabric if your man is slender.

At this point, cut out your own pattern. Do a lot of pin fitting to get your pattern right and fitting well for movement. Then compare your pattern with your ready made shirt to be sure you are correct before cutting out your material.

Use iron-on interfacing on the collar, cuffs, both front closure areas where snaps will be placed, and in pocket flaps and pockets. Snaps are then needed for
the final touch (Western snap buttons, of course.)

Extra details for contrast can be done around the yoke, cuffs, pocket flaps, or any part of the shirt that you choose to use. You can also make the hem the shirt to be overcast. This makes the shirt less bulky.

Be creative and do your own thing. The above are just basic instructions to get you started. Have fun!
