Our new Beginner's Class will be starting on September 27, from 1:00 to 2:00 p.m. Bring some of your friends and have a good time.



It is obvious that there are physical benefits — look at all the 70+ year old people still enjoying square dancing! What I mean by emotional benefits is that of putting aside all your cares and concerns so that you are able to concentrate on the caller and,

consequently, coming away feeling refreshed. How can you possibly convey this feeling to someone else — they must experience it for themselves. It is getting them there that first night that is the whole trick!

One way to get them out the first night is not to send them but take them and stay with them. All classes need angels to help them, so do your club a favor and hang in there for another year of class. Get to know the new dancers and have them get to know you. Not only will your club benefit from you helping out the class, but you will also benefit as you help others and meet many new people with whom new friendships can be built.

GIVE TO SQUARE DANCING AND TAKE A TAX DEDUCTION

Recently a group of dancers were discussing charitable contributions and what groups they gave to during the year, such as United Way, the Salvation Army, churches, etc. Someone made the comment that they wished they could make a charitable contribution to the square dance activity and get a tax write off for it, but that there was no way to do this...

YES, THERE IS! The Callerlab Foundation for the preservation and Promotion of Square Dancing is a non-profit corporation dedicated to preserving the heritage of the square dance activity. The Foundation was established in 1990 by Callerlab, The International Association of Square Dance Callers, as a way to safeguard the history and to promote the growth of square dancing.

The Foundation is the legal entity through which money is rasied to carry out the specified goals of the organization. It is registered with the Internal Revenue Service as a 501(C)(3) corporation, and donations to the Foundation are tax deductible.

The mission of the Foundation is to "preserve and promote square dancing through the preservation of the heritage of square dancing, the establishment and enhancement of a positive perception of square dancing, and education regarding the benefits of square dancing to the general public."

Goals of the Foundation are to "develop and maintain a national advertising campaign to promote square dancing, develop and encourage educational programs directed toward the mission of the Foundation, and provide funding through grants and loans to support the mission of the Foundation. A major goal is to promote the wholesome nature of the activity."

The Foundation has already accomplished much in support of its goals, such as (1) published and distributed almost one million brochures to promote square dancing; (2) produced and distributed over 4,000 promotional video tapes containing television public service announcements to be used in recruiting new dancers; (3) provided a grant to the New England Foundation for the pres-

ervation of square dancing; (4) provided square dancing educational materials to the Czech Republic; (5) funded an educational exchange between master dance instructors from the Peoples Republic of China and square dance leaders in the United States; and (6) in funding a variety of projects all aimed at promoting square dancing.

The Foundation has numerous future projects under consideration but funding is needed to make them a reality.

A sample codicil for last will and testiments for those who would like to bequeath money to the Foundation has been developed and is effective in all 50 states and Canada.

Individuals, square dance clubs, dancer organizations, and caller associations may wish to consider making a donation for this ongoing preservation of square dancing. Checks can be made payable to the Callerlab Foundation.


RECIPE FOR A SQUARE DANCE CLUB SUPREME

Result: One complete club that will serve any size community.



RUTHIE'S SEWING BASKET

As this is the beginning of a new dance season, we will try to get ready for the fall, if you haven't already begun



to do so.

Try to choose fall colors, such as green, orange, brown or yellow, for a change of pace when making your square dance attire for you and your partner.

Check into the patterns that you already have, perhaps modifying a used one. Try changing the neckline of your favorite pattern or adding a ruffle on to the skirt for instance.

Try taking one of the solid colored dresses that you have already made and have been wearing and give it a new look by using a printed material to add some trim to it, such as a ruffle here and there — skirt, bodice or the sleeve trim. You could also add a printed selfmade belt or sash for that special look. Or you could do the reverse procedure by using a plain material on a printed dress. Use an overskirt of lace or eyelet material.

The above procedures can be used for a man's shirt as well by adding a printed yoke, pockets or cuffs sewn over the original material with care or a little trim on th edge. Give it a try, you may just come up with something very surprising and original.

Be sure to pre-shrink your new material before using it on an already worn and washed garment.

Using blend materials are much easier to work with and usually do not require ironing. Stay away from 100% cotton materials.

Also watch for sales on all types of trim. Buy up what you can each time and you will always be ready for your next project.

TIPS FOR BETTER DANCING

Most of this information, although generally known, has not been printed anywhere. Dancers who follow these rules find they dance more, stand less, and in general have a more enjoyable dancing experience.

TAKING HANDS

Take hands with those standing beside you immediately after the completion of any figure. This will help you to see the formation you are in (line, wave, etc.) to do the next call.

1. Hands should be joined within 1/2 second after the completion of any call. Failure to join hands after a call will often result in sloppy lines or waves, which will cause the square to break down trying to do the next call.

2. Elbows must be bent when hands are joined. If arms are outstretched when hands are touching, the set is much too large to operate smoothly.

HOW TO AVOID BREAKING DOWN

1. Believe the caller, no matter what he says. Often dancers will stop cold if a caller tells them to do something and they do not know why he told them to do it. This results in the needless breakdown of the square. Forget worrying about "why" and just do as the caller says. If a dancer refuses to execute a given command, he has no one to blame but himself when this causes his square to break down.

2. If you want to help someone who is lost, avoid talking and instead use hand signals. A very effective method is to point to the spot they should be in. If you talk, this may cause you and others in the square to miss hearing th caller give the next call.

3. If you are positive you have done a call correctly, do not let someone who is unsure of the call make you change your position. This will keep the square going.

4. If a set consists of two strong couples and two weak couples, the



strong couples should be across from each other when squared up, never adjacent. This will give each weak person a strong corner, and will provide each side of the square with strong dancers when doing calls.

So if you and another couple visit a dance where the level is higher than you are used to, if you dance together be sure to square up across from each other. Likewise, if two new graduates dance in your square, be sure that you and the other strong couple square up across from each other.

5. Keep your head raised. This lets you see what is going on. Many people dance looking down at the floor, and thus are out of touch with the set as a whole.

6. Keep the set small. Large sets break down more often than small sets. One way to keep the set small is to touch hands immediately after every call.
